Ms. McGill currently serves on the NC State Banking Commission, and is the founding board Chair of the CFPB Alumni Association as well as a board director for Shelterforce Magazine. She remains committed to international cooperation through her ongoing support of the Robert Bosch Fellowship Alumni Association (RBFAA), of which she is a past treasurer, co-president, and member of its Strategic Review Commission.
