



Participant Code of Conduct for 2021 Season

As adjusted for COVID-19 considerations and Safe Start Washington Phase Recovery Plan

****During this global pandemic it is everyone's responsibility to help prevent the spread of COVID19.**

1) **I agree that I will not participate if I have symptoms of COVID-19 or have been exposed to COVID-19 within the last 14 days.**

2) **I agree to practice social distancing at all times.** As per the CDC, social distancing, also called "physical distancing," means keeping space between yourself and other people from outside of your home and/or family. To do so:

- Stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) from other people
- Do not gather in groups
- Stay out of crowded places and avoid mass gatherings

3) **I agree to wear a mask anytime I am on land,** but may remove it when I am on the water at Sail Sand Point. This adheres to the King County Health directive to wear a face covering in any indoor or outdoor public space where you may be within 6 feet of someone who does not live with you.

4) **I agree that I am visiting Sail Sand Point at my own risk.** SSP is located in a City of Seattle Public Park, managed by the Seattle Parks and Recreation Department and while SSP's clients and staff will have all agreed to follow this code of conduct **SSP is not responsible for the general public's compliance with State, county, city or SSP's protocols for maintaining public safety.** Should my health and/or safety be compromised, I release Sail Sand Point, the City of Seattle or anyone associated with SSP or the City of Seattle including without limitation its officers, directors, staff, volunteers and advisors from all liability, and knowingly, intentionally and voluntarily waive all claims, demands or causes of action of any kind whatsoever.

5) **I will wash my hands before and after using shared equipment and multiple times per visit.** I will bring my own hand sanitizer and use it responsibly- I am aware that sanitizing is not a replacement for hand washing. Hands must be clean for sanitizers to work and in an outdoor setting hand washing is the most reliable cleaning method.
