


**Government Relations**

- Globally, cases top 1.34 million; 74,000 deaths.
- In the U.S. there are 368,000 cases and more than 10,000 deaths. Officials warn this will be the toughest week yet.
- All Los Angeles residents can now apply for coronavirus testing. Today, Mayor Garcetti announced there are “no longer any limits.” LA County residents can register for testing at <https://corona-virus.la>
- American biotech firms asked to offer assistance to UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson in his fight against COVID-19 (note: the Prime minister tested positive for COVID-19 and recently moved to intensive care for treatment).
- The Army Corps is building 22 field hospitals across the U.S. in 18 states, adding 18,415 hospital beds.
- More than 8,000 ventilators were distributed from the national stockpile.
- National Guard now activated across the country.
- California and Oregon sent their ventilators to hot spots. California’s ventilators are going to DC, Delaware, Arizona, and Guam.
- Dr. Fauci reported that New York is experiencing a dip and is starting to level off; signs that mitigation is working.

- St. Vincent Hospital in Los Angeles will be fully functional by Monday, April 13<sup>th</sup>. This was done in partnership with Dignity Health and Kaiser Permanente.
- Over 80,000 people have signed up on the California Health Corp website. This program will be paid for by FEMA reimbursements, Medi-Cal and California’s own reserve.
- California now has 11,336 new ventilators in hospitals.
- Three new drive up testing sites: one at the Glendale Memorial Hospital and two in the Antelope Valley.
- The County is providing free home-delivered meals for seniors impacted by COVID-19.
- The County is working to increase shelter locations – two to three sites with the capacity of 60 per site. The shelters will have medical staff and around the clock security available. The County is also looking at utilizing college dorms for this effort.
- The Mayor emphasized this is a critical week in keeping the momentum going to flatten the curve.
- All Los Angeles residents can now apply for coronavirus testing. There are “no longer any limits.” LA County residents can register for testing at <https://corona-virus.la>
- There are now 13 testing sites across the County, with over 21,000 tests administered at these centers plus another 31,000 tests from other sources.

- Recommendation for poncho use: Place isolation gown over poncho, but not the hat so that it does not get contaminated, and then have someone help you take off the poncho, and clean, then hang to dry so that it can be used the next day.
