The Gale databases offered free during the extended closure are listed below. Students will have to enter the name of the library (Indianapolis Public Library), their zip code, and the state to verify their residence, but they will not need a library card.

Miss Humblebee's Academy (Kindergarten Readiness)

Interactive kindergarten-readiness database for children ages 3 to 6 with lessons in Math, Science and Social Studies, Language and Literacy, Art, and Music. The lessons increase in difficulty as the child progresses through the program and cognitive skills are assessed at regular intervals for measurable improvement toward kindergarten readiness. Parents can track their child's learning outcomes through weekly progress reports that are emailed and available online 24/7. Approximately twenty percent of the curriculum is available offline in the form of printables and practice worksheets.
