College Scholarships:

1. Louie's Tux Shop Model Search

 - \$500.00 award available to any high school senior attending a post secondary educational facility. To apply, submit a 500-1000 word essay in response to the prompt: “*when you look back on your life in 30 years, what would it take for you to consider your life successful? What relationships or accomplishments will be important on this journey?*”

- 4. **College Board – Opportunity Scholarships**
 - Complete a series of 6 Steps in a program created by College Board to help guide you as you apply to college. For each step you complete, you are eligible to earn a scholarship ranging from \$500-\$2,000.. If you complete all 6 Steps, you are entered to win \$40,000.
