### **SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES:**

#### **College Scholarships:**

##### **1. Opportunity Scholarship - Program of TheDream.us**

### **University Specific Scholarships:**

#### **1. Baylor University - Getterman Scholars Program & App Deadline**

### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

#### **Military Selective Service Requirement**

- Seniors, under the *Military Selective Service Act, 50 U.S.C. 3801-3820* **Almost all male U.S. Citizens and male immigrants are required to register for selective service** beginning 30 days prior to their 18th birthday and extending to your 26th birthday.
- Please know that **just because you are registered, that does not mean you will be inducted into the military.** In the event of a crisis requiring a draft, men would be called in a random sequence determined by lottery number and birth year.

### **Senioritis - Know the signs and how to avoid it.**

- Defined as a supposed affliction of students in their final year of high school or college, characterized by a decline in motivation or performance.

  - d. **Remember All the Hard Work** - Don't let 12 years of academic struggles and all of your hard work go to waste simply because you're tired of being.
  - e. **Colleges Can Change Their Minds** - A college still has the option of withdrawing an acceptance if your academic performance is not consistent with what it was when you applied.
