

Dr. Carole A. Estabrooks
Professor & Tier 1 Canada Research Chair
Faculty of Nursing, University of Alberta

Dr Carole Estabrooks is a health services researcher and holds a Canada Research Chair in Knowledge Translation in the care of older adults in residential long-term care (LTC) settings. She is Scientific Director of the pan Canadian, longitudinal research program, Translating Research in Elder Care (TREC). She holds a cross appointment in the School of Public Health at the University of Alberta.

She received her undergraduate degree in nursing from the University of New Brunswick, her graduate degrees from the University of Alberta, and completed a postdoctoral fellowship at the Institute for Clinical Evaluative Sciences and University of Toronto. She has been the recipient of several awards and distinctions among them, the Order of Canada (2016), the Betty Havens Prize for Knowledge Translation in Aging (2014), the CAFA Distinguished Academic Award (2010), and the Alumni Award of Distinction, University of New Brunswick (2007). She is a fellow in the Royal Society of Canada (2020), the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences (2007), the American Academy of Nurses (2011), and the Canadian Academy of Nurses (2020).

Dr Estabrooks is an investigator on numerous studies using observational, pragmatic clinical trial, and social network analysis approaches. She currently leads a study investigating the roles of organizational context and research facilitation in the improvement of workforce and resident outcomes in LTC and an observational study examining the impact of COVID-19 on workforce and resident outcomes in LTC. She co-leads research to establish the routine assessment of quality of life in LTC residents with dementia and to assess the impact of past traumatic stress on resident behaviours and quality of life and on workforce strain.

She has been a member of several advisory boards and panels in the areas of aging, dementia, implementation science and residential long-term care. She is a member of the Canadian Frailty Network.



Dr. Réjean Hébert
Université de Montréal

Professor Réjean Hébert is a geriatrician, gerontologist, and epidemiologist. He is a full professor at the School of Public Health at the Université de Montréal (ESPUM). He was the dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences of the Université de Sherbrooke from 2004 to 2010 and of the ESPUM from 2017 to 2019. He was the founding director of the Center for Research on Aging of the Sherbrooke University Institute of Geriatrics, the Quebec Network for Research on Aging and the Institute of Aging of the Canadian Institutes of Health Research. From 2012 to 2014, he served as Minister of Health and Social Services and Minister responsible for Seniors in the Government of Quebec.



Dr. Suzanne Dupuis-Blanchard

Université de Moncton

Suzanne Dupuis-Blanchard is full professor at the School of Nursing, as well as Research Chair in Population Aging CNFS-Université de Moncton and Director of the Center on Aging at the Université de Moncton. A nurse for 30 years, her research program focuses on the multiple dimensions of aging in place, including aging in the context of official linguistic minority communities. She is a member of several local, provincial and national committees related to aging and currently chairs the National Seniors Council at the federal government. She is the past president of the Canadian Association on Gerontology.



Dr. David Scott

University of New Brunswick, Fredericton

Dr. David Scott is an associate professor of sport psychology in the Faculty of Kinesiology at the University of New Brunswick in Fredericton, New Brunswick.

He completed a B.A.(Hons.) and a P.G.C.E. (teaching degree) at the University of Ulster, Belfast, Northern Ireland, and an MA in Sport Psychology, an MA in Psychology, and a Ph.D. in Sport and Exercise Psychology from the University of Victoria, in Victoria, British Columbia, Canada.

He teaches and does research in the area of sport and exercise psychology. Maclean's magazine has named him as one of the most popular professors at UNB and the Globe and Mail recently named him as one of the outstanding professors teaching in Canada.

He has been a consultant with a large number of government departments and private companies in addition to being a sport psychology consultant with a number of teams and organizations including, the Vancouver Canucks, the Philadelphia Flyers, and the Florida Panthers of the National Ice Hockey League, the Canadian Men's National Gymnastic Team, Bowls Canada, the Canadian National Archery team, Swim Canada, and the West Indies Cricket Team. He is currently a consultant with the Montreal Canadiens of the National Hockey League, the Laval Rocket of the American Hockey League, the Acadie-Bathurst Titans of the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League, and the Dauphin Kings of the Manitoba Junior Hockey League.
