	o Program to Analyze, Record, and Track Networks to Enhance Relationships
	o Essentially a social network analysis tool
	 Used to measure how organizations/agencies within STEP are working together, to assess
	where and how STEP can and should strengthen their partnerships, and to chart progress in
	the relationships and activities of STEP
	o Identifies the members of a network and the relationships between those members
	(cooperative, coordinated, integrated)



	 Data collection will take place from Dec. 7-21st 20 question survey, to be completed online via email invitation
	 2016 PARTNER results Majority of organizations were government or community based (27% and 23%
	respectively) 43% of relationships involved cooperative activities, 26% involved coordinated activities, and 19% involved integrated activities
	 Participants reported an overall trust level of 77% Achievements as a result of PARTNER:
	 Coordinated communication, improved resource sharing, increased access to services for youth and parents/guardians, healthier environments for youth, and reduction of health disparities
