ART

ROBERT GARDEN SCHOOL OF ART ADVENTURES IN ART CAMP (5-13 years)

This fun filled art camp is back by popular demand with professional, award winning artists teaching fine art and creative thinking! Young artists will create two amazing works of art each day. Students will draw using charcoal, pencil, and oil pastels. They will create paintings on canvas in oils, watercolors, and acrylics using color theory and simple techniques to paint realistic landscapes, still life, animals, and seascapes. Sessions A and B will feature different works of art. Supplies are furnished. Bring paper towels and wear an old t-shirt.
