Today's Torah reading is from is from Shemot (Exodus 19:1- 20:23). It describes the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai.	966
Before the Kohen's aliya, it is customary to recite Akadamut, an 11th century Aramaic piyut that introduces the Ten Commandments.	714
The Maftir is from Bamidbar (Numbers 28:26-31). The Haftarah, from the book of Ezekiel (1:1-28; 3:12) is the prophet's well-known and mysterious vision of HaShem and His "Heavenly Chariot."	968
Ashrei (We do not sing the Yom Tov poem, "Y-ah Keili" at home.)	456
Musaf Amidah for Yom Tov – follow the ArtScroll instructions for Shavuot.	674-692
At home we do not recite any of the tefillot associated with Birkat Kohanim.

Song of the Day – Tuesday (We do not recite Anim Zemirot without a minyan.)	164
On the second day of Shavuot it is customary to read the Book of Ruth.	

Note: At home we do not recite the tefillot associated with the Torah Reading. Today's Torah reading is from Deuteronomy 15:19-16:17 and is part of the all-purpose Latter-Part-Of-Yom-Tov reading, also recited on Shmini Atzeret and the eighth day of Pesach; it mentions all of the different chagim.

The Maftir is from Bamidbar (Numbers 28:26-31), same as the first day. The Haftarah is from the book of Havakuk (2:20-3:19). After the first verse,	968
some have the custom of inserting the Aramaic piyut, "Yetziv Pitgam."	969
If it is your custom to recite Yizkor, you may do so here. Yizkor does NOT require a minyan, except for the Kaddish at the end.	810
Ashrei (We do not sing the Yom Tov poem, "Y-ah Keili" at home.)	456
Musaf Amidah for Yom Tov – follow the ArtScroll instructions for Shavuot.	674-692
