The city administration has proposed a new housing code and the proposed ordinance is currently pending at City Council. It is scheduled for action at the August 12th Council meeting. It is a sweeping re-write of the city's housing codes and it aims to enact citywide standards for safe, clean and habitable housing, while strengthening provisions for rooming houses and group living facilities. It also gives the city authority to impose violations for failure to address bulky waste or provide recycling bins. The ordinance has generated some controversy so if these issues are important to you I urge you to review the proposals and let City Council know if you support the housing code.
