The meeting was called to order by Yvonne Matthews at 6:20. Yvonne recognized Janice Castle Dir of Community Engagement

Barbara Robbins then led the group in a short song for AHNA

The Mission of AHNA was read by Paul.

Police Report: Ofc. Adam Demaine reported the September statistics: Part 1 crimes are down 11.1% more information is available on Hartford.gov website broken down by neighborhood. Lloyd Collins arrested for breaking in, 57 prior arrests. Robberies are mostly “apple picking” cell phone theft, 11 car breaks, about average, 8 stolen vehicles, focus has been on 10 Marshall St, also Ofc. Chanaca was able to confiscate a loaded firearm near HPHS at dismissal time. Ofc. Demaine also distributed maps of the Hartford Marathon for Saturday.

West Middle School Volunteer Program: Nicole Rodriguez was not present.

I-84 Hartford Project: Tim Ryan and Kevin Burnham CT DOT has now recommended the lowered Highway alternative to Federal Highway Dept. who will need to approve it. This will necessitate the relocation of the rail lines into Union Station. Next Opening Planning Studio in Asylum Hill will be Nov. 16th at AHCC. Currently they are reviewing entrance and exit options at Sisson, Sigourney and Broad/Asylum.

- John Larson’s proposal is longer term and will not affect this project.
- DOT has been working closely with Knox Inc. regarding the need to relocate depending on ramp locations

One goal of the project is to free up unnecessary real estate which will be given to the City to decide the best uses for.

- Making the highway more efficient will also improve air quality with fewer cars stuck in traffic

City of Hartford Update; Janice Castle responding to the questions raised last month. Archie Byrd from Public Works Dept. answered questions about recycling and trash pickup

- Question about furniture mattresses etc. and additional trash receptacles
 - Mushroom receptacles are in process of being placed to replace Big Bellies
 - Photos of mattresses and tires from out of town, very expensive problem
 - Two bulky waste trucks for the whole City
 - Fines imposed for dumping, property owners are responsible
 - Also working on anti-litter campaign & vigilance
