Executive Director Remarks: David summarized AHNA's 2018 Annual Report.

Police Department Report: Asylum Hill's CSO, Sid Palmieri, (cell -203-400-9265) shared December's statistics: 6 tickets for panhandling, 16 for loitering, 7 for public drinking.

Fire Department Report: Lt. Jesus Lopez, 860-757-4523, Special Services Unit, reviewed the 2018 statistics for Hartford. Residents should contact Jesus or call 860-757-4520 for smoke detectors.

Review of Minutes: The December minutes were approved.

Report from the City: Janice encouraged residents to attend the next Mayor's Town Hall, January 29 at 6 PM. She also offered discounts tickets to Hartford residents for Disney on Ice. She is preparing a report of the 311 calls for each neighborhood so the NRZ may better understand the concerns and needs of the neighborhood. Six neighborhood signs are being made for each NRZ. She will be asking AHNA to confirm where the signs should be placed.

Report by the Ad Hoc Nominations and Governance Committee: David summarized the January 4 meeting. He encouraged residents to consider applying to be a Board member, particularly as the Board needs 2 more residents to be in compliance with the by-laws. A committee will form to update the by-laws. Members are invited to suggest changes.

Report on Pollinator Festival: Carol Padberg shared a video of the first Festival last fall and asked for feedback and suggestions. People applauded the initiative and encouraged more marketing in future Festivals.

Voices of our Neighborhood:

- A new life sized crèche is at the Cathedral
- The Little Park River has been flooding. The Flood Control Commission meets Jan 9 at 9:30 AM at 50 Jennings Rd. MDC will try to explain the overflow.
- Resident from S. Marshall expressed concern about relentless speeding on the block without speed humps. She asked how to get a speed hump.
- A fundraiser raised \$2015 for the proposed Pear Orchard on Niles.
- Wayne Benjamin reported that the Comet roof is shrink wrapped. The newly posted “no parking” signs are effective. They removed 7 truckloads of contaminated soil. They are waiting approval of historic designation that may take 6 months.
- Representatives from the Village Family Center in Asylum Hill described some of their programs including a pre-school, parenting programs and home visits.
- Riverfront Church will be hosting a community lunch at 224, on Feb 10 at 11:30.
