The meeting was called to order by Yvonne Matthews at 6:15. More than 40 participants introduced themselves. Yvonne recognized Barbara Robbins for her involvement in the community and behind the scenes work and support for AHNA.

Police Report: Asylum Hill's CSO, Sid Palmieri, 860-305-7675, continues to issue tickets for loitering (7), panhandling (6), and public drinking (8). A new Conditions Team has formed to focus on quality of life issues. They will be using unmarked cars. Residents shared concerns about loud car radios and mufflers, speeding on Asylum Ave close to West Middle School and ice cream trucks playing music late at night.

Fire Department Report: Lieutenant Jesus Lopez, 860-757-4523, said that all the fire statistics are available on line at the Department's website. Free smoke detectors are available at fire stations.

The May minutes were approved.

Finance Report: Paul reported:

April 1 balance:	\$ 18,304
Expenses:	\$ 1,533
Contributions	\$ 17,500 from Asylum Hill Church and the Aetna
April 30 balance:	\$ 34,270

Yvonne noted that with these additional donations, AHNA is seeking a part-time Executive Director. Ted Carroll shared a press release announcing the position. As Yvonne's term is concluding, the Board is also seeking a volunteer to be Chair of the AHNA Board.

Voices from the Neighborhood:

- Residents expressed frustration with folks who drop off trash in the neighborhood
- Representatives of Friends of Sigourney Park asked for more help in cleaning up the park and for more police presence to discourage drug dealers on the perimeter of the park.
- Residents registered concern about motorcycles and speeding on Ashley Street
