The meeting was called to order by Yvonne Matthews at 6:15. About 40 participants introduced themselves.

The February minutes were approved as amended.

Police Report: Asylum Hill's CSO, Sid Palmieri continues to issue summons for panhandling and loitering. He reported several instances on Willard Street where guns and drugs have been found and arrests made. Police are providing extra security at the schools. In the north half of the city, robberies, shootings, assaults, burglaries and larcenies have all decreased. Auto thefts have increased; residents should not leave their cars running while unattended. April 4 is the first baseball game.

Fire Department Report: Jesus Lopez, 860-757-4523, announced several initiatives including a Fire and Safety Program with the public schools, a Car Seat Clinic (with free car seats available), and the availability of free smoke detectors. He shared the fire statistics for February.

Finance Report: Paul reported:

February 28 balance: \$ 22,646

Voices from the Neighborhood:

- Concern was expressed about dangerous intersections at Asylum and Sigourney and at Asylum and Union Place. Pedestrians need to be reminded to activate the walk lights. Jim Ford, the city traffic engineer said the city is working on accident reduction and will report back about both concerns.

- Residents were encouraged to engage with the many political candidates on all of the issues that concern them.

I-84 Update: : Michael reported that the advisory committee meeting was postponed to March 27, 12:30-2PM at Chrysalis to discuss the interchange and the location of the train station. There is a 3D image on their website. The public forum will be scheduled in April. Rich Armstrong is retiring.

Knox Inc. – Ryan O’Halloran: Knox focuses on environmental education, community gardens and planting trees. Ryan announced a new community garden at Hawthorn and Sigourney Streets. It is a partnership with AHNA, Knox, the Aetna, and neighborhood schools. There will be 50 plots. AHNA received a grant to help create a pollination area. As soon as money is received from the City, there will also be a community garden at Hartford High School.

AHNA’s 20th Anniversary Celebration: Yvonne thanked everyone for attending and making it so successful, with special thanks to Diane and Sarah from the Hartford, and Ted from Leadership Greater Hartford who managed the event. With the money raised, AHNA can take its work of improving the quality of life in the neighborhood to the next level with more volunteers and staff.

- Hartford Public Library is partnering with Hartford Stage to provide free show tickets to residents with a library card.
