He also referenced two grants, one received and the other pending for a total of \$25,000.

Police Department Report: Asylum Hill's CSO, Sid Palmieri, (cell -203-400-9265) shared December's statistics: 2 tickets for littering, 2 tickets for panhandling, 9 for loitering, 9 for public drinking. There was a homicide on Laurel St on January 8th. Cid was able to collect information from individuals in the neighborhood and Detectives were able make an arrest. Cid is the first HPD officer to be issued a body camera which he showed and explained. Progress is being made on Gillett St apartments
