The meeting was called to order by Executive Director David MacDonald at 6:15. Paul read the AHNA mission statement.

Executive Director Remarks: David reported that the membership would vote tonight on a new Director, Rev. Mia Douglas. He reported that new Committees are being formed and residents are encouraged to participate in the work to improve the quality of life in Asylum Hill.

Finance Report: no report was available.

Police Department Report: Asylum Hill's CSO, Sid Palmieri, (cell -203-400-9265) shared March's statistics: 7 tickets for panhandling, 9 for loitering, 1 for public drinking. He tries to help those to whom he gives tickets in an effort to understand and stop their behaviors. Sid is participating in a leadership program and is working on a project to improve the storefronts on Farmington Ave between Laurel and S. Marshall. He will also be participating in a May 8 bike ride with 10 other officers. Lt. Martin Cunningham, (860-719-1130) reported 3 arrests for illegal dumping. Lt Cunningham will provide an update on the number of tickets for unshoveled snow.

Fire Department Report: Lt. Jesus Lopez, 860-757-4523, Special Services Unit, reviewed the March statistics for Hartford. Residents should contact Jesus or call 860-757-4520 for smoke detectors. He reported that most renters do not have renter's insurance and would benefit from that investment.

Review of Minutes: The March minutes were approved.

Report from the City: Andrene Bent-Jarvis encouraged residents to attend a public hearing on the budget on April 23 at 6 PM at Buckeley. April 27 is the Battle of Badges fundraiser. Contact Janice Castle if residents are interested in tours of City Hall. A representative of the Sustainability Office spoke of the Bright Green Hartford project, including free rain barrels and energy audits. Over 30 events this

Donate Life Celebration: Mark Brevard encouraged folks to attend the celebration April 5 from 5:30-7 at Mark Twain House and Museum. 118,000 people are waiting for an organ donation.

Election of Directors: Rev. Mia Douglas was unanimously approved to become a Director of the Board of AHNA, pending the resignation of Dean Amadon, the current representative of Asylum Hill Congregational Church.

Voices of our Neighborhood:

- Spectrum in Motion is offering a 6 week summer program in dance at Asylum Hill Congregational Church, beginning June 21
- Center for Children's Advocacy is leading a 100 Day Initiative to house the homeless with a focus on 18-24 year olds
- \$2000 has been raised for the Community Orchard; \$1000 is needed before the May 18 planting party
- The tarp on the Comet will be removed soon. Slow continuous progress is being made.
- Residents raised concerns about littering and encouraged spring cleanups. Ordinances are in place but Councilman Gale said they are a challenge to enforce. The Quality of Life Committee will address these challenges.

Committee Updates:

- Quality of Life Committee: includes Directors Louisa, Esther, George and Michael. Hopes to schedule a meeting next week. Seeking volunteers.
- Communications Committee: includes Directors Paul, and Michelle, as well as Bernie and Dean. Responsible for communications and membership. Seeking volunteers
- Ad Hoc Bylaws Committee: Director Jennifer is chair. Next meeting is April 10 at 5:30 at HARC
- Program and Fund Development Committee: Director Yvonne is chair. Committee is planning breakfast April 30 for non-profits. Seeking volunteers

Hartford Grocery Store Proposal ~ Healthy Hartford Hub: Director Louisa introduced Rex Fowler who described the need for another grocery store in Hartford and the evolving proposal. Hartford is the 8th worst food desert for cities of similar size. The goal is to

- Increase access to healthy food, particularly to residents of the Promise Zone
- Increase health outcomes, particularly to residents of the Promise Zone
- Provide access to health services

Hartford residents currently spend \$38M at suburban grocery stores. Fowler envisions a \$24M project, providing a full service supermarket that is convenient, on a bus line, and providing free parking with 200 spaces.
