The meeting was called to order by Jackie McKinney at 6:15. Thirty five people introduced themselves on zoom or the phone. Jackie read the AHNA mission and the statement honoring native lands.

Executive Director's Report: David reported that The Community Breakfast on Nov 17 was well received. At the event, AHNA honored Jennifer Cassidy and Yvonne Matthews; both women served the neighborhood in many ways and both chaired the AHNA Board. AHNA honored The Hartford who has contributed so much to the neighborhood. David thanked the Village and Immanuel Congregational Church who recently contributed to AHNA's efforts to raise \$30,000. At the breakfast, details of the Strategic Plan were shared. Initial action steps involving composting, identifying blighted properties and work on Farmington Ave have already begun. David shared a new video about Asylum Hill, created in partnership with The Hartford. David also reported that Santa recently visited S. Marshall St bringing over 200 gifts for the children. The event was sponsored by the S. Marshall Coalition.

City Update: Andrene reported a coordinated effort to collect toys that will be available to residents on Dec 18 from 11-2 at City Hall. Leaf collection continues until Dec 12 (details on website). Andrene will follow up on concerns expressed about Sigourney St.

City Planning Report: Grace Yi announced there will be a Complete Streets Meeting on Dec 13. The City received 19 applications from Asylum Hill last month.

Fire Department Report: Jesus gave the November report. He urged residents not to leave the stove unattended when cooking. He reminded residents to water their live Christmas trees.

Community Court Report: Judge Wu said the focus of the Court is on quality of life issues involving lower level crimes. He wants to focus on getting to the causes of these crimes and providing services to break the crime cycle. Doug Ovian said that UCONN law students are now involved in helping with the work of the Court.

November Meeting Minutes: approved

Committee Reports:

- Quality of Life: Janine announced the next meeting will be Dec 15 at 6 PM. Their goals include reconstituting Friends of Sigourney Park, beginning a monthly cleanup of Asylum Hill, and creating a schedule of events.
- Economic Development: Wayne reported that NINA is proposing to renovate 279 and 285 Farmington Ave as single family homes. Plans for the Comet renovation have been modified and sent to the city for approval. The Chamber of Commerce is working with the City to provide incentives to improve small businesses.
- Communications: Paul reported the committee has been working with The Hartford to create the new video about Asylum Hill.
- Green: Lynn reported the next meeting, focused on the Park Watershed, is Dec 13. At the Harvest Fair on Nov 23, the Mayor recognized Barbara Robbins for her work on composting in Asylum Hill.
- Development and Fundraising: the committee will meet soon and select a new chair.

Presentation on 2022 Open Streets initiative: Nat Gale, Director of Operations in Hartford, announced that on six different Sundays next year, one or two streets will be closed to vehicular traffic from 9-3 to encourage connecting the community outside. The event will highlight small business, public safety and public health. Cultural and recreational programs, music, food and other activities will be planned. The first Open Street will be Farmington Ave from Whitney to Main on May 22. More information is available on safestreets@hartford.gov. Some funding may be available.

Election of Officers: Nominees include Jackie McKinney - Chair, Marian Leist and Janine McMahon - Co-Vice Chairs, Louisa Barton Duguay - Treasurer, and Nancy Rion - Secretary. These individuals were unanimously approved to be AHNA's officers for 2022.

Request for Letter of Support: Ken Johnson from NINA described two blighted properties at 279 and 285 Farmington Ave. NINA proposes to renovate these to become desirable owner occupied homes. He requested a letter of support from AHNA. It was unanimously approved.

Voices of the Neighborhood:

- A Sigourney resident expressed concern about many trespassers on a neighbor's property. The Police recommended posting a No Trespassing Sign. Putting up a fence would be another option.
- Peter Lewis is the new Director of the Asylum Hill Family Center.
