Yvonne reported that the Board will be interviewing candidates for Executive Director and hopes to introduce the new director in September.

Fire Department Report: Lt. Jesus Lopez reviewed the July data.

The July minutes were approved.

My Hart My Vote: Larisa Kottke and Ryan Keating from Leadership Greater Hartford spoke about their pilot project in Asylum Hill to register residents to vote. They will attend the West End Farmers Market and would respond to other invitations to events to register voters. They are also encouraging businesses to give discounts to voters.

Voices of our Neighborhood:

- Georges reported that the effort to paint a mural at Hartford Public High School was rejected by some parents. Mia, Jackie and Bernie offered to work together to see if West Middle School might be an appropriate and welcoming alternative.
- Sigourney Park Clean up will take place in September
- Youth Challenge Walk-a-thon will be Sept 15. They are seeking vendors.
- Concerns were expressed that prostitution continues at 211 Collins St. Public Safety Committee will address the issue, and work with Sid. Suggestions were made to address the root causes and to consider pre-arrest programs.
- Wheeler Clinic is adding 4 community health workers to focus on interventions in the community
