

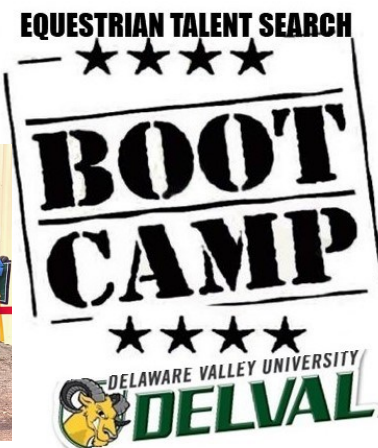

Beckett Run Riding LLC, North Carolina; He coached at **41 National Team Championships** (28 IHSA, 10 IEA, and 3 NCAA), is credited with more than **30 National Champion blue ribbons and 19 IHSA Regional Champion Teams** with Murray State University, Miami University of Ohio, Ohio State, and Liberty University. His Beckett Run team was **2009 IEA National Champs**, the first "barn" team to beat the prep schools. He is the only person to coach **National Champion teams in NCAA, IHSA, and IEA**, and was also team captain on two-time IHSA National Champion teams in college. More recently, coached Liberty University to Regional Champion Team and **Holiday Tournament Champion team in 2017**, and Ohio University to 4th Place at 2019 Tournament Series. His Miami University team was

Top 6 at IHSA Nationals 11 times in a 15 year stretch, won **3 Tournament of Champions and Series Champion**, and won **NCAA National Invitational Championship twice**. IHSA's **National Secretary for 25 years**, honored with **IHSA Lifetime Achievement Award** in 2005, and judges a BUNCH of IHSA and IEA horse shows. BS, MS, University of Kentucky. His son, Matt, was a Team Captain for Miami and coached National Champs of his own at University of Lynchburg and St. Andrews University. Daughter, Hallie, was a Team Captain for Vanderbilt University. Wife, Gwen, was a longtime IEA Director and town Mayor, and now has a show management company.

Clinician: Dr. Cory Kieschnick, Chair of Dept of Equine Science, and Head Coach of Del Val Equestrian. Del Val is IHSA Regional Champs eleven straight years and counting, and has finished as high as 4th in the nation in 2021. Always one of the top teams in Tournament of Champions. IHSA Zone Champion in 2021. Cory did her BS at University of Tennessee and has been at Del Val since 2001—23 years!

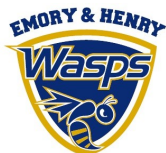

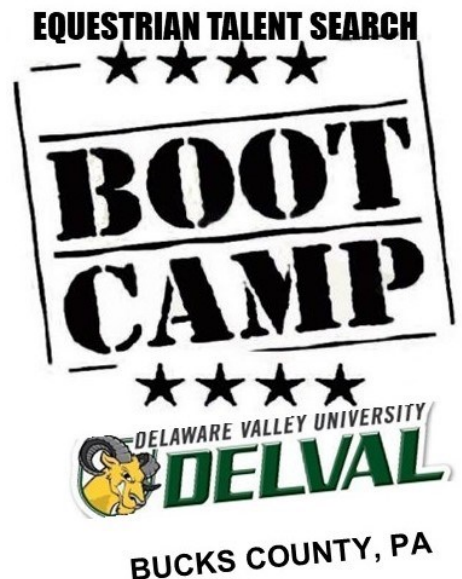

Liability Release Agreement

All entries understand that under Pennsylvania law and North Carolina equine liability limitation laws, a horse owner or sponsor of an equine event may not be held responsible for injuries sustained as a result of equestrian activities. All entries on this list understand that based on their entry in this event they are accepting the risks inherent with equestrian sports of this type. Pennsylvania SB 618, the Equine Activities Liability Act (EALA), now known as Act 93, identifies equestrian activity as inherently dangerous and risky. Your signature on this form, and your participation or your child's participation in this event indicates that you accept the limits of liability resulting from inherent risks of equine activity. Even as spectators, you are subject to the risk of this activity.

The participation of my rider in the Equestrian Talent Search constitutes an agreement and affirmation that the institution making it, and each of its riders, coaches, and trainers and all concerned agrees to hold Beckett Run Riding LLC., its officers and employees, Delaware Valley University and their employees, students, and all other persons, stables, or other entities providing facilities, horses, or equipment for the event harmless for any claim, action, or suit, for injury, property damage, or death sustained during participation in the show or affiliated activities, by the institution or its riders, coach, trainers, or visitors. Participants will operate under the equine liability limitation laws of the states of Pennsylvania and North Carolina.

WARNING: Under North Carolina law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities, which such risks include: (a) the propensity of an equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, death, or loss to persons on or around the equine; (b) The unpredictability of an equine's reaction to sounds, sudden movement, unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals; (c) Hazards, including, but not limited to, surface or subsurface conditions; (d) A collision with another equine, another animal, a person, or an object; (e) The potential of an equine activity participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury, death, or loss to the person of the participant or to other persons, including, but not limited to, failing to maintain control over an equine or failing to act within the ability of the participant.

The following sections apply to ALL riders in ALL States:

Any participant shall be liable for injury, loss or damage resulting from violations of the duties set forth above. Further, a participant involved in an accident shall not depart from the area or facility where the equestrian activity took place without leaving personal identification, including name and address, without notifying the proper authorities, and without obtaining assistance when that person knows or reasonably should know that any other person involved in the accident is in need of medical or other assistance.

By signing this Waiver the undersigned persons specifically represent that he/she; a) is the actual, proper and authorized persons to sign this form; b) understand and acknowledges that he/she is fully responsible for all damages, injuries, death or claims arising from the inherent risks of horseback riding, horse related riding competitions, being around horses in general and acknowledges that he/she waives any and all claims arising from the inherent risks of the activity and/or the ordinary negligence of the show; c) agree to indemnify (stand in the shoes of), pay and hold harmless the horse show production group from all awards, judgments, costs expenses and attorney fees associated with or arising from any claims or litigation that may arise from or are related to the rider's participation in any events or activity; and d) unconditionally promise not to sue or maintain any legal action against, or attempt to make any recovery from, the horse show production group in any civil litigation, mediation, arbitration or alternative dispute resolution proceedings.
