January 19: Pianist Tamila Azadaliyeva

TAMILA AZADALIYEVA opens the season. Tamila has performed as a soloist and chamber musician in the United States, Italy, Spain, Uzbekistan and Kazakhstan. She has been guest soloist with several orchestras, including the Hartford Symphony Orchestra. In addition to performing, Tamila teaches piano at the University of Hartford Hartt School, University of Connecticut, Loomis Chaffee School and maintains a private studio in West Hartford, CT.

February 2: The Casey Sisters

THE CASEY SISTERS have music in their DNA. The girls were raised by two musicians and introduced to multiple genres of music from Classical, Rock & Roll, Country, Gospel, Folk, R&B and Jazz. Aside from their a cappella voices that harmonize on their repertoire of selections, each girl plays multiple instruments including the piano, guitar, ukulele, violin, bass, cello and drums.

February 16: Baroque to Contemporary

FRANK VASI & THE THIMBLE ISLAND SAX QUARTET'S repertoire covers a wide range of music from Baroque to Contemporary, including music from the Jazz, Broadway, Rock, and Popular idioms, as well as chamber music, symphonic, choral, and vocal traditions. They play with a fresh and vibrant style, all while respecting the standards and traditions of serious concert music.

March 1: "Bluesy" Blue Grass

The acoustic duo BluesGrass features two experienced musicians, MARK WHITE & JON SWIFT, who have been steeped for many years in American roots music, including blues, old-time, folk music, and bluegrass (especially its "bluesy" side). Both are accomplished singers and their voices blend in close harmony along with strong and evocative instrumental accompaniment.

They draw upon both contemporary and traditional sources for a well-rounded acoustic music experience.

March 15: The Sound of New England Chorus

The North Atlantic regional champion of Sweet Adelines International, based in West Hartford and under the direction of MARION DEVOKAITIS, Sound of New England Chorus' thirty members sing award winning four part a cappella harmony in the barbershop style. They perform choreographed show tunes, big band hits, beautiful ballads, patriotic and holiday standards. A repertoire that includes something for everyone.
