From the National Trophy Committee



CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

CCA NATIONAL CHALLENGE TROPHY (valued over \$2500.00)

Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed - THE MARTHA RAMER MEMORIAL TROPHY, Bronze by Diana Hiiesalu offered by "The friends of Martha Ramer."

This is a challenge trophy awarded for Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, to be offered through the Collie Club of America Inc. at its National Specialty Show only, to be won three (3) times by the same owner, not necessarily with the same dog nor at consecutive shows, for permanent possession.

Proposal from "The Friends of Martha Ramer"

The bronze by artist Diana Hiiesalu will weight approx. 10 lbs and about 10 inches tall and 10 inches wide which includes the base. The bronze will be mounted on a wood and granite base. The trophy is to be valued over \$2500.00. Included will be a secure case from Star Case Company for its safe passage National to National /person to person.

As you all know our dear friend, Martha Ramer, passed away on July 20, 2017. She dedicated a large portion of her life to the collie, her collie family, and our clubs. Martha bred and owned Collies under the "Society" prefix since 1971. She was a member of the collie Club of America, Inc. for over 40 years.

She bred and owned several CCA National Specialty winners beginning with winner dog in 1993 (Ch. Society Daytime Hero) as well as Best Opposite Sex Smooth in 2005 (Ch. Society There's Your Trouble ROM). She also bred BOV Smooth/BOS/BOB in 2007 (Ch. Edenrock the Mask of Society ROM) and several other Award of Merit winners throughout the years, all while having no more than 6 to 7 adult dogs at one time and one litter a year.

Martha had a passion for keeping our dog clubs alive. She was involved with both her local clubs as well as our National Parent Club. Martha held just about any and every position you can imagine within the dog clubs.

and was the second dog of any breed to earn the titles that she had. She was HIT from novice obedience at the Massachusetts CCofA and Best All-round collie. She was HIT on ducks at the Colorado 1989 CCofA.
