i. The judge who received the second (2nd) highest number of votes will have first choice to judge Intersex

ii. The judge who received the third (3rd) highest number of votes has the choice to move up to the newly vacated assignment and may also choose Intersex if the judge who received the second (2nd) highest votes declined judging Intersex.

iii. Alternates #4, 5 and then the following top names in order on that year's ballot will then have the opportunity to judge the newly vacated assignment.

iv. Any judges whose assignments change shall have amended contracts sent to them by the CCA Secretary

The previous rules with alternates would still take over and are previously described in this section for the class judges and if the Intersex judge cannot fulfill his or her assignment **after** the premium list is published.
