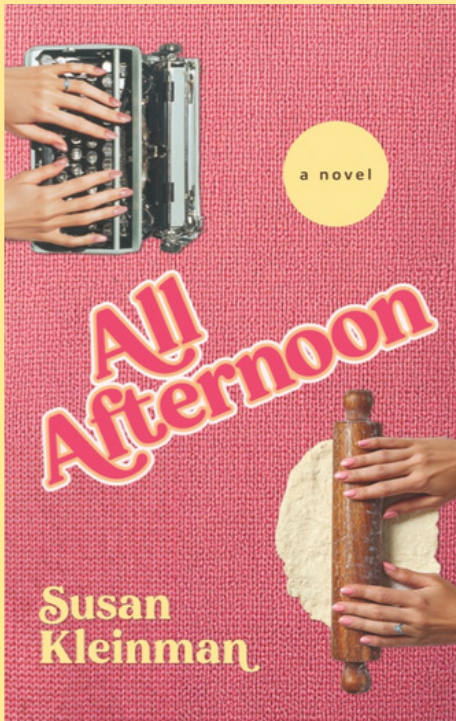


Your next great Jewish read: *All Afternoon*, by Susan Kleinman

Set in a tight-knit Jewish community in 1978, *All Afternoon* is the story of Marilyn Weisfeld, a once-promising writer who abandoned her literary dreams for marriage and motherhood. Now, she's too busy raising children and braiding challahs to even think about what she gave up... until the night an old friend of her husband's comes to dinner. Bestselling author Henry Goldfarb remembers Marilyn's early stories. He remembers *her*. When he urges her to write again, she starts sneaking into Manhattan every week to meet him. Soon, she's catching glimpses of a more fulfilling life she could be living—if only she can find the courage to reach for it.

Susan Kleinman's writing has appeared in *The American Literary Review*, *JewishFiction.com*, *Cosmopolitan*, *The Forward*, *The New York Times*, and dozens of other publications in the US and abroad. A graduate of Penn, she was a Kathryn Gurfein Writing Fellow at Sarah Lawrence College, where she subsequently taught fiction writing.

She has also taught creative writing at The Bronxville Adult School, Westchester Hebrew High School, and The Leffell School.
