Feeding Westchester Provides Thousands of Kosher, Passover Meals to Jewish Neighbors in Need

Elmsford, NY (April 8th, 2020) – This week is filled with religious significance for thousands of Westchester County residents, and Feeding Westchester knows the importance food plays in so many celebrations. This year, the county's leading nonprofit, hunger-relief organization teamed up with the UJA-Federation of New York, the Westchester Jewish Council and Red Oak Transportation to deliver thousands of ready-made kosher meals for Passover right to the doors of our neighbors in need.

"We saw this need coming in the first days of the pandemic here in Westchester County and immediately sourced meals we knew would be needed during this week," said Matt Honeycutt, VP Development for Feeding Westchester. "We're truly grateful to our partners at UJA who took the lead in identifying households in need and to Red Oak Transportation who brought back 15 of their out-of-work drivers to make the deliveries." UJA funded the deliveries by Red Oak Transportation, but only to compensate the drivers for their efforts.
