General Business Perspective:

This proposal, a collaborative approach, is far superior to a vague rule. The Ports' approach involves all stakeholders—businesses, labor, SCAQMD, the Cities of LA and Long Beach and the ports themselves—rather than a command and control rule that creates uncertainty, increases costs, disrupts our economy, and undermines current environmental efforts.
