Excellent communication, interpersonal, and public speaking skills, along with computer proficiency, are required. A bachelor's degree or progress toward completion within one year is preferred.

Role Overview

The Program Director will lead countywide efforts to advance trauma-informed care, strengthen mental health supports, and promote child and family well-being.

- Coordinating county-level activities for the Resilient WEST regional coalition
- Developing and maintaining partnerships to support trauma-informed practices
- Scheduling and promoting required trainings
- Representing the Collaborative at meetings, events, and community engagements
- Managing social media and outreach efforts
- Maintaining the Troup County Resource and Referral Map

This independent contractor position offers an opportunity to support a trauma-responsive, collaborative network that enhances the well-being of Troup County families and will require, on average, about 30 hours per week.
