



Help the Helpers: Individual Leadership Capacity Building with Gabrielle Stewart

Starting Spring 2025, we are excited to introduce the **Help the Helpers: Individual Leadership Capacity Building Sessions**, led by Gabrielle Stewart, our MSW intern and a seasoned nonprofit professional with decades of experience. Many of you may remember Gabrielle from her impactful leadership within Round 2's BRRNWGA coalition and Georgia Family Connection Partnership. Gabrielle is an expert in strategic planning, implementation, evaluation, and fostering stakeholder engagement in decision-making. These sessions are designed to support leaders in navigating the distinctive challenges they face, including compassion fatigue, vicarious trauma, burnout, and balancing personal beliefs with organizational responsibilities. Gabrielle's collaborative approach helps individuals reflect on their leadership styles, strengths, and capabilities to design tailored solutions. The goal is to enhance alignment within organizational frameworks, amplify leadership effectiveness, and unlock participants' full potential. She is currently pursuing her Master's of Social Work at Kennesaw State University and will be offering individual consultations, counseling, and coaching throughout the Spring semester for her clinical hours. These sessions can include, but are not limited to:

- **Assessment of professional skills and capacities to inform professional development and goal attainment action plans.**
- **Professional coaching for transition planning or to improve fit within an organization.**
- **Counseling to address issues that result from compassion fatigue, vicarious trauma, and burnout.**
- **Counseling for crisis intervention for the sudden loss of a co-worker or client.**

Gabrielle and the participant will sign a confidentiality agreement before the first session. As a student, KSU provides clinical liability insurance for Gabrielle, and the certificate is available upon request. These sessions will not be shared with Resilient Georgia staff unless requested by the individual participating.*
