





Words from the Rabbi...

When I first became Rabbi of the JCC almost 9 years ago, yes, I just wrote “almost 9 years ago”. I had two primary goals. The first was to bring the Jewish tradition, with its nuanced beauty, to our eclectic JCC community in a comfortable and meaningful way. The second was to build, and to strengthen, the JCC by connecting the larger Jewish community on and around our beautiful Island.



No doubt these were worthy goals, and I believe that, together, we have substantially begun to achieve them. When the pandemic hit, it was very possible that the growth could have stopped, or worse, reversed. But it did not. Indeed, over the course of the last, very strange, year the community has embraced a new digital presence and we have provided even more people with ways to experience Judaism culturally, educationally, and spiritually.

Winston Churchill famously said that “A pessimist is someone who sees a difficulty in every opportunity, and an optimist is someone who sees an opportunity in every difficulty”. Together we embraced the opportunity.

But, there continues to be much work to do.

Thank God, we are on the precipice of physically returning to the JCC for services! I am excited to also have services in the parking lot and on the beach. Wherever the services are it will be nice to, safely, be together again. I absolutely love the digital technology and plan to make it a large part of what we do going forward. That said, I am sure that most will agree that nothing beats being physically together. (As long as we can do so safely).

One of the joys of this past year was growing an active and interactive electronic community. Whether it was religious services, classes, music, cooking demonstrations, a trip to Israel, a magic show, Seders, or a discussion about Israel, we have been “together” more over the last year than ever before. Integrating our in-person services with our zoom and streaming technology will help to continue our growing connection to those who cannot physically join us for services. I have heard this referred to as “In the room and in the zoom”.

Shavuot is coming on Monday, May 17th and Tuesday, May 18th, with Yizkor services on Tuesday. When boiled down to its core, Shavuot is about creating a Jewish people and a Jewish nation. God brought our ancestors together to give them the Torah. It was an important moment in the history of the world. In order to do this, God needed to move some 1.3 million people from Egypt to Mount Sinai. Once the Pandemic is finally over, you will have a choice. If you want, you will be able to come to the building and join us for services. If, for some reason, you cannot physically join us, you will be able to click a hyperlink, and be a part of the community. What a great world we live in!

Whether in person or on a digital platform, we are continuing to build and strengthen our JCC community. Our services and programming synthesize the Jewish traditions of learning and spirituality, with comfort and a sense of belonging.

What the pandemic has highlighted for us is the reality that community can be defined in many ways. There is the community on the island and the community off the island. On the Island: There is the community south of the causeway and the community north of the causeway. There is the community







February 9, 2021

- Reports were received and reviewed from Office Manager and 8 committees.
- Having been previously nominated, Diane Hoffman was elected to complete the term of Jon Lombardi who resigned last month.
- M. Babst reported that we must start thinking about procedures for opening our building.
- I. Morgenthal reviewed draft of proposed 2021 budget. After discussion several changes were made, and the budget with changes was adopted.
- S. Pepose and R. Van Naarden reported on some of the things we are doing in the building because of the pandemic.
- S. Pepose also reported on technical items being considered to further enhance the actual and visual attendance at future services. His committee will come back to the Board with suggestions and costs.

- P. Rosenzweig reported on the 'Meet the Match Fundraiser'. As a result of one notice to the congregation, and before any individual calls were made, we have already exceeded \$32,000 raised.
- L. Dinkfelt reported that our 5 year lease on our copier is about to expire. After some discussion, R. Van Naarden agreed to look into this and recommend our new lease or purchase.
- Approval was given to D. Hoffman to proceed with necessary filings to hold our 50/50 Raffle with winners to be determined and announced at our Yom Kippur Break the Fast.

March 9, 2021

- Reports were received and reviewed from Office Manager and 5 committees.
- Rabbi Jay reported on very successful services and programs held.
