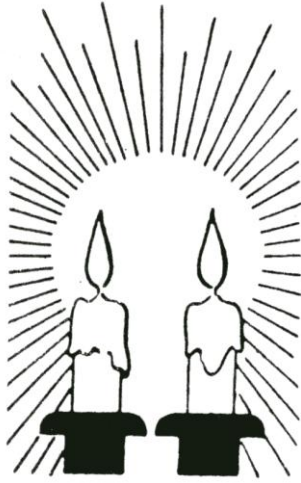

## A MEDITATION

### BEFORE THE MOURNER'S KADDISH

Memory is the bridge that links the living and the dead. They are not wholly dead whom we remember, whose spirit continues to live as an influence in our lives. This is why we remember the anniversaries (*yahrzeit*) of our departed. This is why we also perform a special service of remembrance during the first year of bereavement.

The memorial prayer is in part an act of reaching out to God with the pain of our loss, so as to find comfort and consolation. In renewing our trust in God's existence and his love for us, we become fortified to face life and its demands, despite our grief.

Our memorial prayer also gives direction to the emotions engendered by bereavement. We cannot undo the inevitable fact that we are mortal and therefore subject to a termination of our earthly existence. But if the termination of a life that was precious to us induces us to think more deeply about our own lives, then our grief is not a futile emotion. We can see more through a tear than through a telescope.

The Jewish observance of a memorial to our departed directs us to channel the emotions engendered by bereavement into a greater love of God, a greater devotion to the Torah, a greater concern for the well-being of our fellow man.

The Kaddish is only one prayer in the entire service. However it brings the meaning of the services to its highest climax. It proclaims the majesty of God, and thus assures us of His care to sustain us in our sorrow. And the recognition of God's majesty implies the highest goals for living to which a man may be summoned.

## **A Prayer for Our Soldiers**

Dear Heroes

As we gather together to recall the lives of those who have left us, recall of the words of a true hero of Jewish People, Hannah Senesh. She was a Hungarian Jew who moved to Israel before the founding of the State. Hannah was one of thirty seven Jewish men and women who were trained by the British Army to parachute into Yugoslavia during the Second World War. Her assignment was to help save the Jews of Hungary who were about to be deported to the German death camp at Auschwitz. Hannah was arrested at the Hungarian border, imprisoned and tortured, but she refused to reveal details of her mission and was eventually tried and executed by firing squad. To this day she is regarded as a national heroine in Israel, where several streets and a kibbutz are named after her. Most famously, she is remembered for her poetry.

Hannah Senesh wrote prophetically, "There are stars whose light reaches the earth only after they themselves have disintegrated. And there are individuals whose memory lights the world after they have passed from it. These lights shine even in the darkest night and illumine our path..."

Today we honor the heroes of our lives, those who gave our lives meaning and direction. Their light continues to illumine our path, the glow of their eternal presence is felt even in our darkest nights. They may not have been renowned for their poetry or acts of death-defying courage, but their lives enriched ours, their character shaped ours, their efforts helped to make us who we are today. We sense their smiles, we hear their voices, and we feel their guiding hands ushering us into a New Year full of life, happiness and hope.

May the souls of all our loved ones past inspire us to lead good and worthy lives in lasting tribute to their memories.
