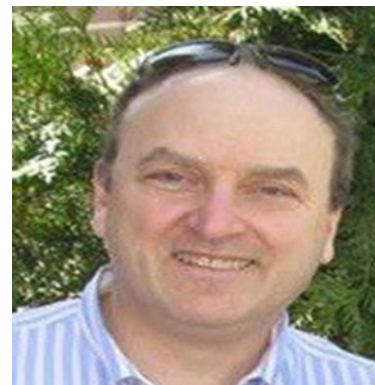

Words from the Rabbi...

A High Holy Day Meditation from **Mahzor Lev Shalem** (Page 23), which I have edited slightly:

May it be Your will, Adonai our God and God of our ancestors, that the year 5781 be one of balanced and mindful growth for us as individuals, for our families, and our communities. May we return next year in good health and free from covid and its harsh physical, emotional, and economic impact. May we also return next year in appreciation of a year of greater peace, a year of greater harmony, a year in which we deepened our lives through learning and the performance of mitzvot, a year in which we were conscious of the Divine Presence, a year in which we strengthened our shared commitment to tikkun olam, the betterment of the world.



It is July and Rosh Hashanah is on September 18th. Why would I write a meditation for the High Holy Days now? I write it because, while on Passover we are accustomed to asking: "Why is this night different from all other nights?", this year, indeed, we will oddly be forced to recognize that "These High Holy Days are different from all other High Holy Days."

In normal times, Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur provide us with an annual exercise of looking back on the year that was, reflecting, and looking forward to creating positive change in the year that will be. It is a time to go to Temple, a time to sing familiar songs and to say timeworn prayers. It is a time to hear the shofar, a time to see that person that you only see a few times a year, and a time to see if the Rabbi has a decent joke (for a change) and good messages to make the New Year meaningful. It is a time for familiarly wonderful smells and tastes in our homes; the scents of chicken soup, gefilte fish, brisket, turkey, kugel, are bolstered by the sweetness of a round raisin Challah followed by apples and honey.

It is a time of renewal and healing. And yes, this year, we will need plenty of renewal and healing.

There is no doubt that the coronavirus pandemic will put a bit of a crimp in our usual High Holy Day plans. However, it will also give us a unique opportunity to take what we have become used to, and to infuse new ways to make this significant time of year interesting, transformative, and moving.

In the last few months we have become adept at virtually providing meaningful religious services (with some fun thrown in for good measure) as well as quality educational and cultural programming. We have had fun finding new ways to be together, even as we remain at a distance.

As a community we have had the blessing of virtually being together for Purim, Seders, book discussions, movie reviews, Torah study, healing services, musical Kabbalat Shabbats, Shabbat Dinners, Havdallah, and Bar Mitzvahs. Unfortunately, we have also shared sad moments with virtual funerals and Shiva visits.

Importantly we have provided daily evening services for those (like myself) who need to say the Kaddish prayer for loved ones.

While nothing can replace being physically together, and nothing is as satisfying as a warm hug, there is a unique intimacy in being able to closely see all of our faces in the little squares during the zoom services and programs. Being able to look into your eyes during a service or program is a holy moment.

Most heart-warming to me is that, like a family or the best of friends, our JCC community has remained close in these times of forced separation. Our virtual time together has created real strength and real kinship. The great thing about the Jewish tradition is that it has always provided us with ways to mold our traditions to unique moments in history. It is one way we have survived for 3000 years.

The goal for the High Holy Days will be to embrace this strange time and to use it as a catalyst to create the warmth, intimacy, and holy moments of our traditional "in-sanctuary" observance within the universe of the myriad possibilities created by the incredible new technologies that lay before us. By doing this we will provide a unique Rosh

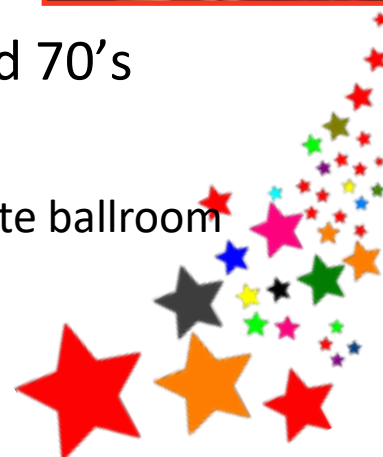
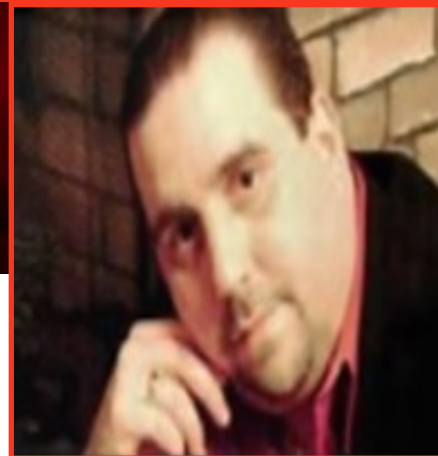

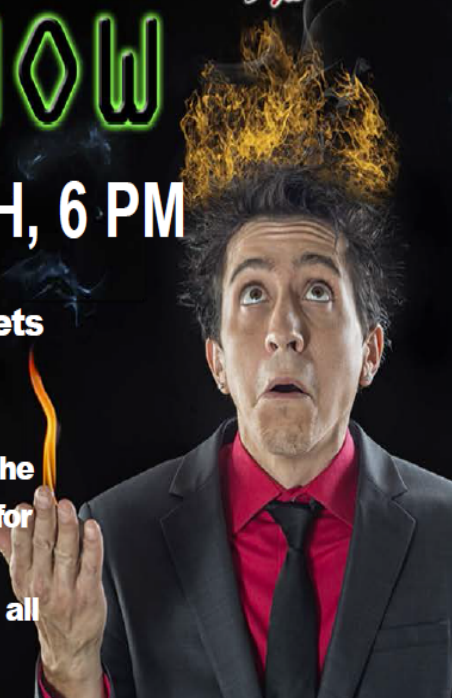

April 21, 2020

- Reports were received on Scholarship, Office Manager's report, Ritual, Membership, Facilities, and Pavers
- Rabbi Jay and M. Babst reported on several recent events and on activities planned.
- I. Morgenthal gave Treasurer Report which was approved.
- P. Rosenzweig discussed plans to apply for a loan/grant under the Payroll Protection Plan, a part of the Cares Act of SBA.
- Security was discussed, as was the safety and health issues. Motion made and passed to install 5 Hand Sanitizer stations in building.
- I. Babst reported that Women's Auxiliary is ready to move forward with plans once it is permissible. She also reminded the Board that articles for the May/ June bulletin are due now.
- R. Van Naarden reported that we are finalizing plans to switch to Comcast as our supplier. This will provide much faster service, will improve our camera coverage for security, and will enable us to take advantage of streaming our religious services.
- D. Shatz reported on Programming. Many events are planned. Details will be announced when finalized. A motion passed to allow R. Van Naarden to continue negotiating a contract with Sharp Family Singers for a 2021 program.
- A discussion was held on plans to address changes needed because of the Corona virus, and on our summer activities. This will be an evolving crisis which we will monitor. A Contingency committee is being formed.

May 12, 2020

- Reports were received on Office Manager's report, Membership, and Women's Auxiliary.
- Dan Krupinski, with local Health Dept. gave an overview of the virus and local restrictions. He then answered lots of questions from Board members and agreed to be available as we had more.
- Rabbi Jay and M. Babst reported on several recent events and on activities planned.
- I. Morgenthal gave Treasurer Report which was approved.
- P. Rosenzweig reported on our efforts to get an SBA PPP loan. There are no monies available at this time.
- R. Van Naarden reported on Building & Grounds activities. We will switch over to Comcast from Verizon next week. Five sanitizer stands and a digital thermometer have been ordered. He also got bids to disinfect our building.
- S. Pepose gave a report from the Contingency Committee. Included were discussions on sanitizing and cleaning the building, when to open it, and summer activities. After much discussion it was decided that we would keep the building closed at least through June, we would postpone the Welcome Back Brunch, we would cancel the July Bazaar, and continue zooming services.
- It was agreed to have an additional and Special Board meeting in late May.

June 9, 2020

- A motion was made to invest \$50K in Israel Bonds, and \$100K in a conservative portfolio that has had a consistent return of about 2.2% This is money now sitting in a checking account. Motion passed 10 to 1 with 3 abstentions.

them to give you the details. Some of you responded to my request for input, not as many as I had hoped, into the actions we have taken. One of the most important summer events that we do is the beach service, this was also the one thing that the majority of the respondents missed the most. We are looking into ways that we can conduct this favorite activity without putting anyone at risk. We will take all steps necessary to accomplish this, including limiting the services to members only, if necessary. The ultimate decision rests in your hands. No-one can make that choice, but you and your loved ones. No one should judge the decision that you make, certainly not me. We have members that fall on both sides of this perplexing issue.

The last area that I will touch upon is our use of Zoom and Live Streaming from the pulpit of the JCC. Thanks to the work of Rob Van Naarden, Stuart Pepose and their committees we will be able to begin broadcasting from the sanctuary. As I am writing this to you, the live streaming is in a beta testing mode, with the help of an outside company that will assist us during the High Holidays, We will be able to live stream the Rabbi conducting services from his dais. Let me stop for a moment to discuss the use of Cantor Zachmy, due to the requirements of him having to quarantine for 14 days on both sides of his trip from Israel, it has become impossible for him to be our Chazan for this year. We attempted to have him join us via Zoom, but he feels it is impossible to do this because of the time differences between the two locations. He told us he was uncomfortable, due to halakha, to conduct services prior to or after the actual day on which the holiday falls. We understood this and will look to use his services next year. We rejected the idea of prerecording him conducting the services, and playing it back for a myriad of reason. We are now in the process of looking for a Chazan for this holiday season. If anyone knows of a Cantor looking for work please contact me, or Rabbi Jay. We are confident that our search will be successful. Now back to the live streaming, we are assured in the success of our services being interactive and meaningful for all of us. We are still planning on having Alliahs, with those being honored being spotlighted via zoom on your viewing screen. Once the Ritual and the High Holiday plans and procedures are completed, we will get them out to everyone. Please, once it is up and running, try out the link on our website, for live streaming of our services. You might like it and use in the future. It is one thing positive that this pandemic has brought us, that will live on as the JCC moves into a post Covid time.

In closing; if there is a chance to have some of you or all of you with us in the JCC for the High Holidays; we will do so, but that is a BIG IF! IF the virus has ended. IF there is a treatment in place that will help those afflicted, go through a complete healing. IF there is a vaccination in place, that keeps those inoculated safe and stops the spread and IF we can have those that want to be in the sanctuary there without endangering anyone who must be there, then and only then will it happen. Let's keep our prayers going in the right direction. I know this is not what anyone of us wanted, nor dreamed, would be our reality, but it currently is. Let us stay united and focused that this will end soon and we will all be together again.

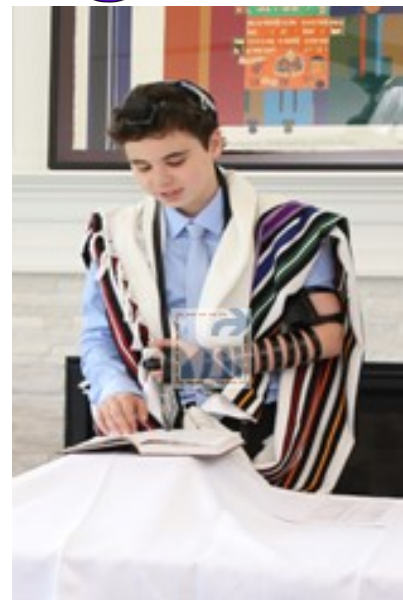

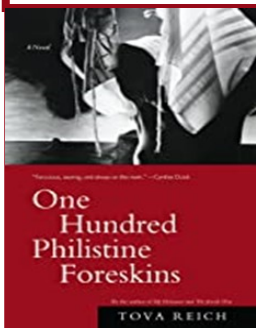

One Hundred Philistine Foreskins centers on the life of Temima Ba'alatOv, known also as Ima Temima, or Mother Temima, a charismatic woman rabbi of extraordinary spiritual power and learning, and an utterly original interpreter of the Hebrew Bible. Temima is revered as a guru with prophetic, even messianic powers—one who dares to raise her woman's "naked" voice even in the face of extreme hostility by the traditional establishment.
