Words from the Rabbi...

On LBI time is marked in many ways. There is a summer season and an “off” season. There are seasonal rentals, monthly rentals, and weekly rentals. There is Memorial Day to Labor Day. There is high tide and low tide. There are “traffic lights on” and “traffic lights blinking”. Each day is marked from sunrise to sunset. It is this last marker of time on which I wish to focus.



In our tradition we pray three times a day. The recitation of morning prayers and evening prayers are guided by the times the sun comes up and when it goes down. The light of a new days brings myriad possibilities; it enables us to see, in full form, what might previously have only been a vague and shapeless shadow.

Why do I point this out? In the creation story, God’s first “action”, the very first thing the Deity does, is to create light. What does light symbolize? In the creation story, it is a starting point. Everything else that happens only occurs after, and perhaps because of, that initial light. Is that first light physical? Is it the light of an idea? Is it the light of an ideal? Is it the explosion of the “Big Bang”? The answer is hard to say. But what cannot be denied is that after that point, after light is created, everything changed dramatically. We learn from this that light is powerful indeed.

Light is central to our tradition. Through the desert, God led the Israelites in a pillar of fire. God told Moses to create a Menorah that would be constantly lit in the Tabernacle. One of the Ten Plagues involved the complete absence of light. We have been charged with the task of being a “Light unto the nations” (Isaiah 49:6). The light we as a people are intended to be is, I believe, inextricably tied to that first light. Whatever pure, beautiful idea or energy was made tangible by that light; it is in each of us.

Our tradition also teaches us that we can be this light by living a life of Torah, connecting to God, and doing acts of loving-kindness. In truth, I am not so certain that the way to live a life can be broken down into aphorisms; however, I do know that the things we do, the actions we take or do not take, comprise who we are and how we are viewed by others. It is our actions that will either make us a beacon to those around us, or merely a flashlight with a dead battery.

The next big holiday we will celebrate is Hanukkah. This year we light the first candle on Tuesday, December 10, 2020. Over the course of 8 days we will light our Menorahs.

We have come through our first and God Willing, last Covid High Holiday Season. I want to thank everyone that was involved in the preparation and the implementation of our emotional and meaningful Rosh Ha Shannah and Yom Kippur services. We have learned a lot about what it takes for you our congregants to enjoy a spiritual connection via zoom. Irene and I enjoyed being with all of you during our services this year, although Irene would have rather greeted everyone at the front door of the JCC, and I would have presented the appeal from the pulpit. Like everything else that we have done since March we have made many firsts, and found ways to improve what we have developed. We had been told that our High Holidays would give us all a spiritually uplifting and extremely meaningful event. I have to be honest; I did not know how that would be accomplished? But it was, everyone who participated expressed that to us. We had over 160 individual log ins purchased. At one point we had over 375 people join us for Zoom services. We had almost as many people join us for the second day of Rosh Ha Shannah, as we did for the first day. We had the ability to offer members Aliyah and readings to honor our donators and community workers. I am sorry if you or a family member did not receive an honor this year, that you may have felt that was earned, but we had a limited number to distribute. I know that we will make up for that next year. We could see the actual Torah portion as it was been chanted. Though our services were abridged to fit into the time frame that Rabbi Jay and Cantor Geller had established, there was enough time for all to enjoy our Chazzan, who's beautiful voice rang out through all our devices, confirming that the search committee had recommended the right choice. This was the first time the JCC had a female cantor lead us in prayer, based upon all of the positive feedback we received, I do not think it will be our last.

In order to do this, we will join together each of the 8 nights of Hanukkah on Zoom. We will have a special activity, and then light candles.
