# Words from the Rabbi...

The Welsh poet, W.H. Davies, wrote a poem entitled "Leisure". It is beautifully written, but the opening line is packed with meaning. Here is that first line:

*What is this life if, full of care,  
We have no time to stand and stare.*

I thought of this line this afternoon as I sat and stared at our grandchild, a beautiful boy, just born to Sammi and Reid. A little human, fashioned in the image of God. And I am just standing and staring as he breathes in and out. Just standing and staring as he yawns. Just standing and staring as he opens, then closes, his eyes. Just standing and staring as he stretches. Just standing and staring as my daughter, who I stood and stared at 30 years ago, is lovingly adoring this little human fashioned in the image of God.

When do we take the time to simply stand and stare? When do we afford ourselves the opportunity to acknowledge the beauty of a moment? Too rarely, I fear.

Our world operates at a never-ending warp speed. It, and we, move from task to task, from place to place, and from goal to goal. We leave no time to think, no time to reflect, and no time to appreciate. We do not stand and stare at the wonder of the world around us.

God knew of humanity's inability to stand and stare. This is why God created Shabbat. It was a creation borne of God's love of, and concern for, those created in the divine image. It is in the quiet still moments of reflection that our souls grow.

# Words from the Rabbi...

Many of us are now back on our little piece of paradise, enjoying family, friends, community, and, yes, the natural beauty that the Island has to offer. Bruchim Habaim! Welcome!

As you probably know, the natural beauty of the Island is bolstered this year as we are busy celebrating the JCC's 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Faith, Family, Friends, and Fun. I bet that the handful of people who formed the JCC would marvel at the fact that it has become 325+ members strong and continues to grow. They would smile at the varied programs and activities that we provide. They would nod in approval at the breadth of our services from daily minyans to Friday night beach services.

I hope you will help us to celebrate the JCC by coming to our special anniversary programs and/or joining us for our Gala on August 10<sup>th</sup>. Perhaps you will place an ad in the Gala's add journal, or maybe you will donate in honor of our 75th. Check the website or call the office to participate!

Back to my message for this bulletin. Too often, I think we lose sight of the daily splendor and wonder that Long Beach Island provides. How could this be? One might say it is human nature to become desensitized to the grandeur around us. However, Torah and our rabbinic tradition have attempted to create a paradigm in which we would not lose the wonder.

It begins in Leviticus, Chapter 19 where God told Moses to: "Speak to the entire congregation of the children of Israel, and say to them, 'You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God, am holy.'"

This might cause one to ask, "what does it mean to be holy?" Certainly, many of us have a vision of Jewish holiness. Too often, I fear, we see it as a person with a long beard, in a tallit shucking back and forth. This is a form of holiness, but it is not the only way to be holy.

Here is a definition of holiness that I learned from Rabbi Paul Plotnick: "Holiness is when you treat something differently. When you separate it from the regular; from the routine; from the mundane...".

Our tradition has us treat things differently in many ways. Shabbat is different from the rest of the week. The Torah is different from other books. Kosher is different from non-kosher. The relationship between a spouse, a parent, a child, or a grandchild, is different from other relationships.

# Words from the Rabbi...

Treating things differently helps to provide a simple and attainable holiness goal. This summer let's try to make things holy by not allowing them to become mundane. We should acknowledge that the things that LBI, and our JCC community, provides to us are special. We should acknowledge the gift of the glorious sunrise and the sunset. Being present to things in our lives, to acknowledge them and bless them, provides an opportunity for us to express that these things are holy. When we express that holiness exists, we become holy. When we become holy, we have the opportunity to spread that holiness to others.

Blessings are a way to acknowledge holiness. Below is a non-exhaustive list of blessings that we might be able to say as we wander from ocean to bay or from Holgate to Barnegat Light.

## Upon seeing the ocean

ברוך אתה ה' אלהינו מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם שֶׁעָשָׂה אֶת הַיָּם הַגָּדוֹל

Baruch Ahtah Adonai Eloheinu Melekh Ha-Olam Sheh-Ahsah eht Ha-Yahm Ha-Gadol

Praised are You, Lord our God, Sovereign of the universe Who made the great Ocean.

## Upon seeing wonders of nature (lightning, shooting stars, and a sunrise):

ברוך אתה ה' אלהינו מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם עֹשֶׂה מַעֲשֵׂה בְּרָאשִׁית

Baruch Ahtah Adonai Eloheinu Melekh Ha-Olam, Oseh Mah'ahseh v'reishit.

Praised are You, Lord our God, King of the universe, Source of creation.

## Upon hearing thunder or seeing a storm:

ברוך אתה ה' אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, שְׁכֹחַ וּגְבוּרָתוֹ מְלֵא עוֹלָם

Baruch Ahtah Adonai Eloheinu Melekh Ha-Olam, Sheh-ko-kho u-g'vurahto mah-lay olam.

Praised are You, Lord our God, King of the universe, whose power and might fill the whole world.

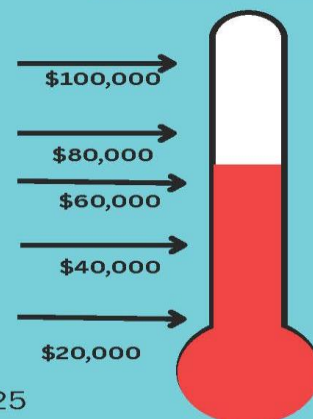
# From our Board of Trustees . . .

Every summer, Vivian Levy and Lucy Webster spend a month with their father at his lake house — separately. Red Dog Farm

Growing up on his family's cattle farm in western Iceland, young Orri has gained an appreciation for the beauty found in everyday things: the cavorting of a newborn calf, the return of birdsong after a long winter, the steadfast love of a good (or tolerably good) farm dog. But the outer world still beckons, so Orri leaves his no-nonsense Lithuanian Jewish mother and his taciturn father, Pabbi, to attend university in Reykjavík.

Pabbi is no stranger to cycles of life and death, growth and destruction. He is pursued by the memory of a volcanic eruption and its aftermath, and so many years of hard-scrabble farming have left their mark. Jaded, and no longer able to find joy in his way of life, Pabbi falls into a depression soon after Orri goes away to school. Orri, feeling adrift and aimless at the end of his first semester, comes home.

For the first time, Pabbi allows Orri to help him run the farm. Despite their conflicting attitudes, Orri and Pabbi must learn to work together. Meanwhile, Orri meets a kindred spirit on the internet: Mihan, a part-time student. Over time—and countless texts and phone calls—their connection deepens. By year's end, Orri must decide whether he wants to—or should—return to university, and what a future with Mihan would hold, if she'll have him.
