Words from the Rabbi...

How are we to process our shelter-in-place, our isolation, and our economic shutdown? It is not easy. Does our Torah have an answer? Does our tradition provide guidance?

It is an oft-cited notion that Judaism favors action over mere thought, or faith. We don't merely talk about love of God and humanity; we do things to physically express our love of God and the world around us. We are taught from an early age to do good deeds and we are, almost genetically, compelled to try to make the world a better place. This manifests itself in many ways.

As a "people", we tend to place an emphasis on education. As proof of this, simply Google "Nobel Peace Prize" and find the plethora of articles about how Jews are disproportionately represented on the list of Nobel Honorees. One genesis of this need to learn, and the consequent educational success of our people, can be traced to our tradition of studying Torah.

Uniquely, we Jews don't passively read the Torah; we don't simply accept what is contained within our holy scripture. Rather, we actively study it, discuss it, and dissect it. The Rabbinic tradition, from which we are all descended and to which we are all connected, teaches us to never be happy with understanding a word or a sentence merely as it is written. Because of this, when we read the Torah, we strive to seek alternative meanings and broader ideas. The Text is more than the words that are strung together; it is more than the narrative and the laws. The Text is to be explicated and used to inform our lives.

If you join me in one of my many Zoom classes, you will find that we study Torah, or Talmud, or the prayers, we rarely read a sentence and move on. We discuss it and try to understand. What follows is often a "Zoom free-for-all". That is part of what makes the learning fun. But, in truth, this is one way that our scripture becomes truly "Holy".

But why have we placed such a focus on the study of the Torah? In Pirke Avot, at 5:22, we are told that Yochanan Ben Bag Bag (yes, that is his name) said of the Torah: "Turn it, and turn it, for everything is in it...". So important is the Torah to us that Pirke Avot, at 3:18 says that it is a "Tree of Life to those who take hold of it, and those who support it are fortunate". The tree metaphor is perfect. By giving us food, wood, shade, oxygen, and more, a tree provides for all facets of our lives. Our tradition tells us that the Torah does all of this and more.

In a few short weeks we will be celebrating the holiday of Shavuot, which, among other things, commemorates our receipt of the Torah at Mount Sinai. Our tradition tells us that as Moses was on the mountain our ancestors stood at its base. But, interestingly, we are also taught that all Jewish souls were present. In this way, we were all there to witness God's revelation and to receive the Torah.

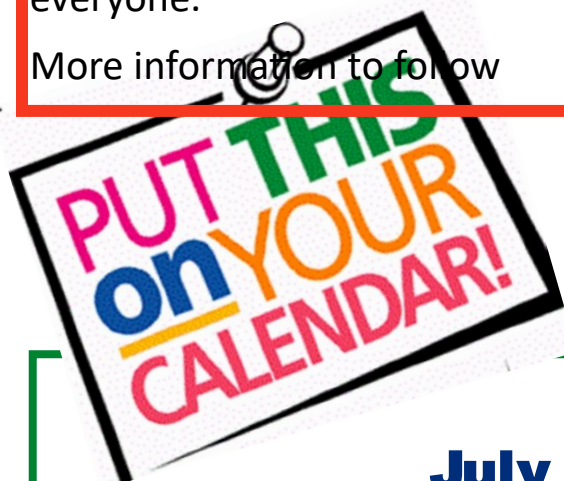

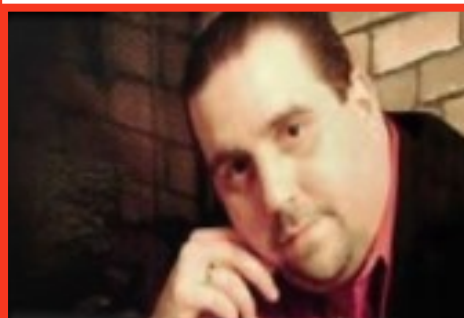

Board Meeting Summaries

January 14, 2020

Attendance: Present: M. Babst, I. Babst, C. Denker, L. Dinkfelt, S. Fruchterman, Rabbi Jay, I. Morgenthal, S. Pepose, P. Rosenzweig, D. Schweighardt, D. Shatz, R. Valentine, and R. Van Naarden. On Phone D. Paris, D. Pripstein

- Reports were received on Scholarship, Membership, Pavers, Office Manager's report, Ritual, Facilities and Beautification.
- We have a total of 292 paid members and this is 17 less than 2018. A letter was sent to those who have not renewed for 2019 informing them that we will be removing them from our membership roster.
- Rabbi Jay reported on several recent events and on activities planned.
- Cliff Denker and Lexa Merson were welcomed as new Board members, and Leslie Dinkfelt as Office Staff representative. C. Denker's term is until August 2021, and L. Merson will serve until August 2020.
- M. Babst reported that we have a signed contract with Rabbi Jay for the next 5 year period. He also announced that he will not be seeking reelection when his term is up in August.
- I. Morgenthal gave Treasurer Reports for November and December, and then led discussion on 2020 Budget. Among items changed were adding an income line for Security Fee, and doubling the Expense item for Police Protection to \$30,000. Members were encouraged to make other suggestions which I. Morgenthal will then incorporate into a final budget for approval at Feb. Mtg.
- Ritual committee reported that it is still exploring ideas to have a minyan at each Friday eve and Sat. services
- L. Dinkfelt reported that Dues letters have been mailed, and the Office Staff is working on issues concerning payments by Credit Cards .
- Security was discussed. Making progress on installing a new Security system with fobs for all members.
- I. Babst reported on activities of the Women's Auxiliary upcoming for the summer season.
- R. Valentine reported on the work on new Website. Several members have volunteered to help.
- M. Babst reported on activities planned by the Chavurah group.
- Under New Business D. Shatz led a discussion on Programming. Five possible events were discussed and follow ups on these will take place.
- Rabbi Jay was asked to start planning an Interfaith Service.
- P. Rosenzweig announced that he is forming a committee to look into new methods of Fundraising. Howard Fruchterman and Rob Van Naarden are on this committee, and they would still like a few more members.

February 11, 2020

- The main purpose of this Feb. meeting was to discuss and adopt a budget for 2020. Other items can also be brought up.
- I. Morgenthal presented the latest version of proposed budget. After much discussion and some changes, a 2020 budget was approved. There was 1 abstention and everyone else voted to approve.
- I. Morgenthal then presented a motion to consider major changes to the allocation of our funds. The purpose is to provide additional current income without incurring any unnecessary risk. To give the Board more time to consider the reallocation, it is to be brought up for a vote at our next Board meeting.
- Several proposed program activities for the coming season were discussed. These included fundraising programs. Additional information will be sought before a decision is made on some of these proposals.
- Rabbi Jay thanked Board members and Congregants for their support during the difficult time of his father's passing.



Words from the Rabbi...

Which leads me to how we process. We process by doing. We process by living. We process by discussing. We process as individuals. And we process as a community. Our ancestors wandered in a wilderness on their way to receipt of the Torah. Our ancestors had not been out of Egypt for 400 years, and it must have been discomfiting to be out in the open surrounded by nothing. There must have been such uncertainty.

The uncertainty is what makes our current situation so anxiety provoking. At the end of the Israelites wilderness isolation, they received the Torah. Perhaps we will receive something that will have made our time in isolation worth the wait. While only time will tell what awaits us, for now, I am amazed at how the Zoom platform, and others like it, have helped us to connect. Seders, services, and educational programming have all continued, or even increased. A modern, miracle?

The receipt of Torah represented a new beginning in the history of the Jewish people. Is our new connectedness another new beginning? To be continued..... *Rabbi Michael S. Jay*

Until then, use the intercom to gain access into the JCC. We will be sending updates once the system goes live. This is just one of the steps that we have taken to protect our members, and employees. - I. Morgenthal gave Treasurer Report which was approved. After much discussion the Board approved a change in the investment of our funds, including the purchase of \$50,000 in Israel Bonds. This plus the other changes will give us additional income at minimal risk
- Security was discussed. Making progress on installing a new Security system with fobs for all members. Also, a locked mail box will be installed within the building for members to drop off mail for the office.
- I. Babst reported on activities of the Women's Auxiliary upcoming for the summer season.
- R. Valentine reported on the work on new Website. It should be ready next month.

- A discussion was held on plans to address changes needed because of the Corona Virus. This will be an evolving crisis which we will monitor.
- An Emergency Special Board meeting was held on March 12. In view of changing conditions due to Corona Virus the decision was made to cancel all JCC activities until further notice. Services are cancelled as well as Passover activities. The Office will remain open but people will not be allowed in. Ten Board members participated and the vote was unanimous.

Dear Congregants,

As Chair of the JCC of LBI Ritual Committee, along with my Committee members, I would like to wish everyone a healthy and safe summer!

In 2015 the Ritual Committee proposed initiating Saturday Shabbat services year-round. The approval by the Board was to initially provide one Saturday service monthly. If successful, the Board would agree to year-round Shabbat Services. As we all know, the rest is history!

Never could I have imagined Ritual Services via videoconferencing! Rabbi Jay, along with Zach Lombardi who chanted the Megilla, conducted our first Zoom service on Purim. This was followed by Kabbalat Services and both Passover Seders. Prior to Passover, Rabbi Jay started conducting daily Ma'ariv Services, followed by Saturday Shabbat Services via Zoom Conferencing! Oddly enough, two years ago the Ritual Committee proposed an expansion to conduct daily services during the summer. Unfortunately, at that time we had very limited success.

We have now become accustomed to the safety and comfort of attending services at home via the internet!!! Due to the health and safety concerns from Covid-19 and the acceptance of Zoom Conferencing for services, Rob Van Naarden has contracted for set up of autonomous HD streaming from the JCC Sanctuary. This will provide a wide angle view through an existing JCC camera, with sound. Rob is working through some connectivity issues with our new Internet Service Provider (ISP) and will resolve these issues soon! Even before we are permitted to return to the JCC, this will be operational and a viable option for our congregants to view services from their computer or phone.

I would like to assure you that Rabbi Jay, the JCC of LBI Board, and Ritual Committee are making every effort to provide safe and healthy options for our Summer and High Holiday Services when we're able to return to the JCC and beaches on LBI. Our intent has always been to have our Congregants be comfortable and safe when attending services!

Our first Shabbat on the beach last June, for the first time, had a contracted Police Officer of the Long Beach Police Department present. Since that Shabbat Service, the JCC of LBI felt it necessary to provide our Congregants an increased level of safety and security year round when attending Services. This, as we know now, has become standard in most synagogues!

Today we are faced with a totally different type of safety; a reality no one could have ever imagined last June! Maintaining social distancing, wearing protective masks and gloves, are now the order of the day! Our State and Federal leadership are trying to figure out how to safely navigate the populace through daily living routines to keep everyone healthy, safe, and free of the Covid-19 virus. We, as individuals, are all thinking of and contemplating how to move forward with recommendations our government will provide.

Once again the JCC wants our congregants to not only feel safe, but be safe! It has already begun by providing you the option to view Zoom Services now and streaming of Shabbat services when allowed back into the JCC. On April 21st the Ritual Committee presented ideas to the Board and the Board approved a Committee be established to explore and make recommendations. The Committee is titled Summer and High Holiday Contingency Committee or SHHCC. We have begun not only exploring some of these options, but have already begun implementing two of the ideas. The first is the purchase of five Purell Stations. The second is increasing frequency of HVAC system filter changes and investigating HEPA filters. Whatever ideas are being investigated, ultimately the Government and CDC guidelines and recommendations will be followed.

Once again, the Ritual Committee would like to wish our congregants, their families, and friends a healthy and safe summer.
