NYS's 1115 Waiver Public Comment Day and DSRIP PAOP Meeting: The NYS Department of Health (DOH) will be holding the Downstate Public Comment Day for New York's 1115 Waiver program on **November 29th, 2018 at The New York Academy of Medicine, 1216 5th Ave, New York, NY 10029 in the Reading Room on the 3rd floor.** The day will begin with a working session of the Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment (DSRIP) Project Approval and Oversight Panel (PAOP) followed by a public comment opportunity. OneCity Health Partners with NYC Health + Hospitals to Launch ExpressCare: In collaboration with NYC Health + Hospitals, OneCity Health led the design and implementation of ExpressCare, a new walk-in urgent care model at NYC Health + Hospitals. The goal of ExpressCare is to ensure patients receive the right care in the right place at the right time, by offering a fast, convenient way to access medicine afterhours without having to resort to an ED visit for non-emergent, routine care. ExpressCare sites are located on the campus of large tertiary and community hospital sites and will offer patients connection to a consortium of services. Patients visiting ExpressCare who do not have a primary care provider can be assigned a provider that's right for them onsite.
