VA's SSG Fox Suicide Prevention Program

Focuses on reaching out to military veterans at risk for suicide (suicidal ideation, past suicide attempts, etc.)

Criteria for the program:

- 1. Must be a military veteran with a discharge status other than dishonorable.
- 2. Must be willing to sit for an intake to determine eligibility which includes an intake form, a psychosocial assessment, and a screening.
- 3. Veterans must have an eligible score to qualify for the program.
- 4. Once a veteran is determined eligible for the program, he/she will receive case management.
- 5. Assistance may include employment, counseling, and housing subsidies.


Services on a non-clinical level regardless of eligibility:

- A. Periodically meeting with his/her assigned case manager.
- B. Assistance in finding housing opportunities (if needed)
- C. Assistance with employment opportunities (if needed)
- D. Connecting the veteran to services at the VA (if needed).
- E. Assisting the veteran with applying for a service connected disability rating through the VA (if applicable).
- F. Connecting the veteran with mental health services at The Family Center. (Partner organization).

All services are provided free of charge for eligible veterans through the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Services are provided to all veterans and their loved ones with tender loving care and a listening ear.


