### **Dietrich W. Botstiber Foundation Award**

The Botstiber Foundation awards a student with an \$8000 unrestricted scholarship. This is distributed at \$2000 per year for four years pending maintenance of full-time status and a minimum of 3.0 GPA.

Drexel University is proud to offer partial scholarships to five juniors who understand Drexel's experiential education blended with co-op and are creative, curious, and work well with others. The award is for \$8000 per academic year, renewable for up to five years pending full-time status and maintenance of at least a 3.0 GPA. All scholarships go into effect upon the recipient's meeting university admissions criteria.

### **Harrisburg University of Science and Technology**

The Science and Technology Scholar Award is given to all high school seniors and juniors participating in the Delaware Valley Science Fairs. It will cover up to \$15,000 for four (4) Academic Years at Harrisburg University of Science and Technology. This year, the university will offer an additional scholarship of \$1500.00 to be added to any UG Merit Scholarship from HU that a Delaware Valley Science Fair student receives upon applying and being accepted to HU. The university recommends recipients file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) before the start of the academic year and complete any state grant applications by their deadlines. Once they have received the FAFSA data, they will provide recipients with a complete financial aid package that details their overall aid eligibility, including the scholarship as well as any state and federal grants for which they qualify. These awards are not transferable and nor are they stackable with any other scholarship from Harrisburg University.

### **University of the Sciences Scholarships**

University of the Sciences will award scholarships to first, second, and third place winners of the eleventh-grade fair. First place winners receive \$9,250 per academic year. The second-place winners receive \$7,500 per year and the third-place winners receive \$6,250 each year. These monies can be used for tuition only and are effective upon enrollment in Fall 2022 in an undergraduate or first-professional program offered at the University of the Sciences. It is renewable for up to four years when enrolled as a full-time student in good academic standing.
