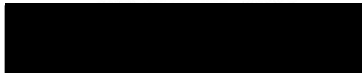

City Improvements Coming to Your Area

Major mobility improvements are planned to begin **November 2025** on **Studebaker Road between 2nd Street and Carson Street**. This improvement is part of the Elevate '28 Infrastructure Investment Plan, a historic initiative to enhance Long Beach parks, community facilities, mobility access and streets. Learn more at lbelevate28.com.

Planned Improvements:

The project will include rehabilitation and maintenance work to create smoother roads and extend the life of the pavement, along with reconstruction/addition of curb ramps and sidewalks to meet current ADA standards. In addition, the project will upgrade bike infrastructure to improve safety and connectivity for people biking along Studebaker Road and Loynes Drive. Additional enhancements include safer crosswalks and intersections that are designed to reduce unsafe vehicle speeds and updated traffic signals for improved traffic flow. Expanded, landscaped medians are also planned to enhance both safety and the streetscape. Improvements will also be made to public transit stops.

Key Information:

- **Work Hours:** Any time from Monday to Friday, between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- **Potential Impacts:** *Efforts will be made to limit disruptions during the phased project, which will be completed in one segment at a time.* However, there will be temporary access at the intersections of Studebaker Road and 2nd Street, Loynes Drive, Eastbound and Westbound SR-22 On/Off Ramps, 9th Street, Anaheim Road, Mantova Street, Driscoll Street, Atherton Street, Southbound I-405 Off Ramp, Northbound I-405 On Ramp, Los Santos Drive, Stearns Street, La Marimba Street, Los Arcos Street, Willow Street, Barbanell Street, Barrios Street, Spring Street, Pavo Street, Rosebay Street, Mezzanine Way, Wardlow Road, Parapet Street, Keynote Street, Walkerton Street, Harco Street, Los Coyotes Diagonal, and Parkcrest Street. At least, one travel lane in each direction will be open during construction.
- **Estimated Completion:** Construction is expected to take 24 months with planned completion by **late 2027**, pending weather or other unforeseen circumstances.
