An Update from Haven Ministries

I want to inform you of Haven Ministries' new location for our **Resource Center AND food pantry**. We have decided to reformat our food pantries from large, one-day monthly events to a more personal approach following a daily "store"-type of distribution model. This format also gives Haven Ministries' staff and volunteers more time to develop relationships and connect people to area resources including other food pantries. Our Resource Center will be moved from Centreville to the same property as the food pantry. The Headquarters with the **Resource Center and Food Pantry** will be open Monday, Wednesday-Friday 8:30-4:30 and Tuesday 7 am- 7 pm. The new location is **206 Del Rhodes Avenue, Queenstown, MD 21658**. The opening date at the new location is **Monday, July 13, 2020**.
