Harford County requires us to start our building project with a multi-purpose community arts center, a large, flexible space seating 325-500, for performances, art gallery exhibits, banqueted events, workshops/conferences, meetings, and much more!

The amphitheater will have 500 permanent seats with an additional 500 in lawn seating and will be constructed after the multi-purpose community arts center is complete. Harford County is reviewing our plans by Quinn Evans Architects and Whiting-Turner Construction Company for the multi-purpose arts center, amphitheater, and future additional buildings, that will provide quality spaces for performances, exhibitions, and educational arts programs.

As soon as our plans are approved by the County, we will develop the 41-acre site for the multi-purpose arts center.
