August 2 and 9 - Paul and the Pandemic: Join DCE Matt Nabinger for a two-week series on the apostle Paul and his scriptural writings that continue to offer wisdom for today.

August 9 - Powers and Principalities - and the Grace that is Greater: We tend to think of sin as individual wrong actions, but for Paul, sin is so much more complex and nefarious. In this session, we will place Paul's ancient Jewish view of sin and our modern American struggle with racism in dialogue with one another. As we engage with various scripture passages by Paul, we will explore the good news that God's grace is a present and concrete reality in which we are invited to participate, even in the midst of struggle.

August 16: Fam Chock will lead us in an examination of the relationship and intersection between the African/Black American Civil Rights movement and the Asian-American movement, including an exploration of the myth of the "Model Minority" and how it is used to oppress and divide the common interests of both communities.

August 23: 50+ years ago in 1968 Martin Luther King, Jr was in the process of organizing a Poor Peoples Campaign to address issues around poverty, racism and to challenge the Vietnam War when he was assassinated. Perhaps you've heard about the NEW Poor Peoples Campaign building momentum through the last several years under the leadership of Revs William Barber and Liz Theoharis (Presbyterian!). Chris Foster will present and answer questions from her experience of learning from and being involved since 2017 (in Rhode Island), Washington State while on sabbatical (2018) and in Montgomery County and Washington DC since coming to serve at BHPC. August 30: Dr. Karl Klontz, epidemiologist with the Food and Drug Administration, will update us on the status of the global Covid-19 pandemic. Discussion will cover the status of infection in all six World Health Organization regions and summarize vaccine developments.

8:30 In Person Worship Begins on Sunday, August 23

As BHPC plans its 1030 a.m. Sunday services this fall to be mostly on line, we look forward to finding ways to gather together. Thus, for those interested, we are starting an outdoor, in person 830 a.m. brief meditative service on Sundays. We will gather with Pastor David at 830 a.m. on the grass near the labyrinth on Sundays for a contemplative service.

Weather permitting – if it is raining at 830am, the service is cancelled. This will be a contemplative service of scripture, prayer, meditation, homily, silence, and distanced communion. Anyone who would like to participate in communion must bring their own elements, and those who would like to sit should bring a chair, though there may be some limited bench seating. There will be no singing nor music most Sundays. Masks and social distancing will be required. RSVPs will be required.

We will limit the service at first to the first 20 participants who RSVP to Linda@bradleyhillschurch.org. RSVPs will open at 7:00 a.m. on the Monday before the Sunday service. Don't email Linda until 7:00 a.m. Participants will not be able to participate two weeks in a row unless there is room as determined Fridays at 3:00 p.m. If you are feeling under the weather, do not attend for the protection of all. These services will begin on a trial basis on August 23. We hope this allows those who would like to connect in person and feel they are ok health wise to gather, to join in some in person worship.

KEEPING UP WITH GIVING DURING THE SHUTDOWN



BHPC's 2020 Stewardship theme – Abundant Blessing, Abundant Gratitude, Abundant Giving – continues to frame the life our church. Even during this time when we cannot gather in person, we hope that each of you can discern how God continues to shower blessings on us all, individually and as a church family, and in gratitude for those blessings, give abundantly to support God's work at BHPC.

Now more than ever, we want to ensure that everyone is aware of the many methods of giving that are available, whether you are a long-time BHPC member, a virtual visitor, or looking to simplify your giving habits. So, here is a comprehensive list of the ways you can give to BHPC.

Online: All methods of online giving will direct you to Realm, BHPC's virtual connection tool, where you can securely enter any giving amount, designate which "fund" should receive your donation (e.g., "General Giving," the "Annual Pledge" or even the "Easter Fund"); and choose whether to make a one-time donation or a recurring donation. For all online giving, you will need a credit or debit card. There are three methods of online giving:

- **The "Give" Button:** Simply click the red "Give" button found on the top right corner of the BHPC website and you be directed to Realm.
- Text "BHPC" [space] dollar amount" (ex. "BHPC 150" for a \$150 gift) to 73256 and follow the link.
- **Log into Realm** via the App or from the website and choose the "Giving" option.

Check: Please make checks payable to "Bradley Hills Presbyterian Church" and mail to the church office. As with online giving, you may indicate a special designation by writing that in the memo field.

Gifts of Securities (e.g., stocks, bonds, etc.): Transferring securities to Bradley Hills' brokerage account is a great way to donate appreciated securities while potentially avoiding capital gains taxes. To learn more about this giving option, please see our website under the **SERVE** tab and then "Ways for You to Give."
