Rabbi Dresner and Temple Beth Tikvah:

During his time on the pulpit, Rabbi Dresner was the conscience of Temple Beth Tikvah.

Already well-known as a Freedom Rider during the Civil Rights Movement with MLK, Jr., Rabbi Dresner initiated numerous thought-provoking and ground-breaking programs and practices here at TBT, positioning our Temple as a leader in the greater Wayne community.

Below are just some of his many contributions:

- •Scholar-In-Residence Program, in which scholars from a variety of disciplines spent the weekend at TBT lecturing and leading discussion groups throughout the weekend.
- •Rabbi Shai Shacknai Memorial Lecture that has continued for the past forty-three years.
- •Annual Confirmation Class trip to Israel, where he guided hundreds of our students through Israel with very hands-on experiences in Israeli history and contemporary life for our students.
- •Adult Bar/Bat Mitzvah classes for congregants who never experienced this milestone at 13 years old.
- •Annual Religious School Trip to the Lower East Side in Manhattan, and to the Lubavitch community in Brooklyn to give them the experience of the history of Jews in the United States.
- Eighth Grade weekend at Camp Kutz, to absorb the opportunities available to them through Reform Judaism, and to help them enjoy a camp experience with other Jewish teens throughout the region.
- Well Known Guest Speakers were regularly invited to TBT to promote goodwill and justice in the world.
- Full participation of Women both on the bima and in the governance of the temple – leading to the installation of the first woman president of the congregation.
