



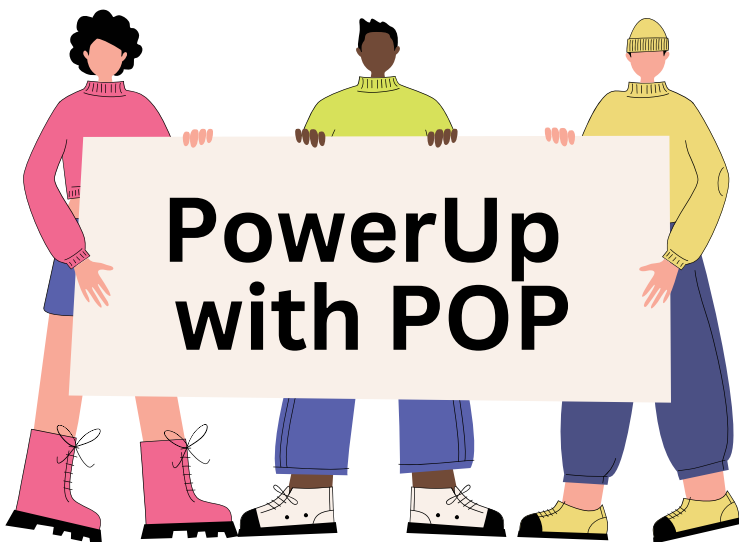

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College and Career Readiness School-Community (CCR) Alliance Committee

The College and Career Readiness School-Community (CCR) Alliance is an advisory organization that will establish plans for school and community collaborations that build necessary life skills for students and families to live. It is our vision that children and families will have resources, skills, and opportunities to pursue meaningful careers by meeting high school and post-secondary requirements. One of our primary goals is to identify and create innovative collaborative programs and partnerships that supplement and enhance current programmatic efforts designed to engage and advance Gary Community School Corporation (GCSC) students and adults toward Career and College Readiness. We have established the committees listed below to guide our efforts.

- **The Executive Committee** is the policy-making arm of the CCR Alliance and is responsible for the general management of CCR Alliance endeavors and projects.
- **The Academic & Social Emotional Learning Committee** assists students with meeting Indiana graduation requirements and developing life skills essential for career and college readiness and other opportunities.
- **The Post-Secondary Competency Skills Committee Chair** assists students and other adults with achieving post-secondary competencies.
- **The Employability Skills Committee** assists students with learning and demonstrating employability skills through Project-Based Learning, Work-Based Learning, or Service-Based Learning.
- **The Resource Development Committee** secures funds and other resources to develop a sustainability plan for CCR Alliance's continued work and community support.
- **The Evaluation Committee** identifies, develops, and promotes processes and procedures to evaluate and monitor the effectiveness of all CCR Alliance programs/services.

Our current partners include Boys and Girls Club, City of Gary, Mayor's Office, Community HealthNet, Gary Community School Corporation, Gary Area Career Center, Indiana Parenting Institute, Indiana University Northwest (IUN), Junior Achievement, Legacy Foundation, Purdue University, GearUp, and Purdue Extension of Lake County. 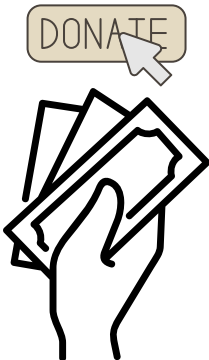
