How does it work?

A practitioner volunteers to deliver the workshop to their charity or organisation of choice free of charge. Insights then provide up to 12 Insights Discovery Personal Profiles, (Foundation and Management chapters) giving our practitioners the materials they need to deliver the session.



What is the benefit?

- Offering the Gift of Discovery allows you to build stronger relationships with your clients by offering them a 'value add' to the work you already do with them.
- It helps the charities to improve the performance of their organisation so that they can do more good in their communities
- The scheme gives LPs the chance to boost their own corporate social responsibility efforts and enhance the reputation of their company, alongside collecting case studies to add to their portfolios

What are the criteria?

The organisation the practitioner wishes to work with must be a small charity, not-for-profit or social enterprise. The workshop will be for up to 12 delegates who should be members of the leadership team or board.
