The Epistle

The Gospel

John 11:32-44

When Mary came where Jesus was
and saw him, she knelt at his feet and
said to him, "Lord, if you had been
here, my brother would not have died."
When Jesus saw her weeping, and the
Jews who came with her also weeping,
he was greatly disturbed in spirit and
deeply moved. He said, "Where have
you laid him?" They said to him, "Lord,
come and see." Jesus began to weep.
So the Jews said, "See how he loved
him!" But some of them said, "Could
not he who opened the eyes of the
blind man have kept this man from
dying?"

Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed,
came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a
stone was lying against it. Jesus said,
"Take away the stone." Martha, the
sister of the dead man, said to him,
"Lord, already there is a stench
because he has been dead four days."
Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you
that if you believed, you would see the
glory of God?" So they took away the
stone. And Jesus looked upward and
said, "Father, I thank you for having
heard me. I knew that you always hear
me, but I have said this for the sake of
the crowd standing here, so that they
may believe that you sent me." When
he had said this, he cried with a loud
voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead
man came out, his hands and feet
bound with strips of cloth, and his face
wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them,
"Unbind him, and let him go."

Sermon

The Renewal of the Baptismal Covenant

The congregation gathers at or faces the baptismal font.

Through the Paschal mystery, dear friends, we are buried with Christ by Baptism into his death, and raised with him to newness of life. I call upon you, therefore, as we celebrate the Festival of All the Saints who have entered into this Baptism, to renew the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and all his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in his holy Catholic Church.

Celebrant: Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

People: *I do.*

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Celebrant: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People: **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church,**

the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Celebrant: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

The Celebrant concludes the Renewal of Vows as follows

May Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins, keep us in eternal life by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord. **Amen.**

Prayers of the People

We are called children of God, and that is what we really are. Let us pray then in all trust and love to God, who is our Father, and let us say:

– For all Christian Churches, that they may grow in solidarity and come closer in unity, let us pray:

R/ Lord of glory, hear our prayer.

– For those who suffer from poverty and misfortunes, from persecution and injustice, that they may be convinced that Christ is on their side, let us pray:

R/ Lord of glory, hear our prayer.

– For those who lack the courage to break with temptation and sin and for those who dare not commit themselves to follow the gospel of Christ, that the saints may inspire them and us, let us pray:

R/ Lord of glory, hear our prayer.

– For all of us here, that we may build community, and that the seeds of holiness may grow in our hearts and deeds, let us pray:

R/ Lord of glory, hear our prayer.

– For our beloved dead, that they may rest secure in the love and joy of the Lord, let us pray:

R/ Lord of glory, hear our prayer.

I now invite you, as the names of our dead are read, to come forward and light a candle as a prayer of remembrance for any of those whom you hold in your heart

God of hope and Lord of the future, through the saints you inspire us today with new hopes in the future of the world and of people. Make us realize, Lord, that with your strength our boldest dreams can come true and even be surpassed: that justice, peace and love are worth living and dying for, and that one day you will crown your own work in us through Jesus Christ our Lord. **R/ Amen..**

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite
love you made us
for yourself, and, when we had fallen into
sin and become
subject to evil and death, you, in your
mercy, sent Jesus
Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share
our human
nature, to live and die as one of us, to
reconcile us to you, the
God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross,
and offered himself,
in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice
for the whole
world.

*At the following words concerning the
bread, the Celebrant is to hold it,
or to lay a hand upon it; and at the words
concerning the cup, to hold or
place a hand upon the cup and any other
vessel containing wine to be
consecrated.*

On the night he was handed over to
suffering and death, our
Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he
had given thanks
to you, he broke it, and gave it to his
disciples, and said, "Take,

eat: This is my Body, which is given for you.
Do this for the
remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you:
This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Celebrant and People

**Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.**

The Celebrant continues

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN**

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say, All: **Our Father...**

*Priest: Alleluia, Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us, **Therefore let us keep the feast, Alleluia!***

Facing the people, the Celebrant says the following Invitation

The gifts of God for the People of God, take them in remembrance that Christ died for you and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

Act of Spiritual Communion for those at home: In union, O Lord, with the faithful of your Church where the Holy Eucharist is now being celebrated, we desire to offer you praise and thanksgiving. We present to you our souls and bodies with the earnest wish that we may always be united to you. And sacramentally, we beseech you to come spiritually into our hearts. We unite ourselves with you and embrace you with all the love of our souls. Let nothing ever separate you from us. May we live in you, and may you live in us, both in this life and in the life to come. Amen
