A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

The Gospel

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

Jesus himself stood among the disciples and said to them, "Peace be

with you." They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost.

He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence.

Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. – We ask you for healing and strength for Canon Glenworth Miles, Rector of St George's Brooklyn as he recovers from a massive stroke and for the members of that community as they enter into a time of transition. And so we pray:

R/ Lord our God, hear your people.

– We ask you in union with the Churches of our Anglican Communion to give rest to the soul of the Duke of Edinburgh and consolation to his wife and family, and for all those for whom we mourn and see no more. And so we pray:

R/ Lord our God, hear your people.

– We ask your healing hand and strength for all those on our parish's prayer list, for all who have asked for our community's prayers and for any people or intentions which we may now share.....*Pause....* And so we pray:

R/ Lord our God, hear your people.

**The Great Thanksgiving for Easter
(Scottish Episcopal Church)**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God
It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Worship and praise belong to you, Author
of all being. Your power sustains, your love
restores, our broken world. You are
unceasingly at work, from chaos bringing
order and filling emptiness with life. Christ,
raised from the dead, proclaims the dawn of
hope. He lives in us that we may walk in
light. Your Spirit is fire in us, your breath is
power to purge our sin and warm our hearts
to love. As children of your redeeming
purpose, freed by him who burst from the
tomb and opened the gate of life, we offer

you our praise, with angels and archangels
and the whole company of heaven, singing
the hymn of your unending glory:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord God of power and
might. Heaven and earth are full of your
glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is
he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

Praise and thanksgiving be to you, Lord of
all, for by the Cross, eternal life is ours and
death is swallowed up in victory. In the first
light of Easter glory broke from the tomb
and changed the women's sorrow into joy.
From the Garden the mystery dawned that
he whom they had loved and lost is with us
now in every place for ever. Making himself
known in the breaking of the bread,
speaking peace to the fearful disciples,
welcoming weary fishermen on the shore,
he renewed the promise of his presence
and of new birth in the Spirit who sets the
seal of freedom on your sons and
daughters. Before he was given up to
suffering and death, recalling the night of
Israel's release, the night in which slaves
walked free, at supper with his disciples he
took bread and offered you thanks. He
broke the bread, and gave it to them,
saying: "Take, eat. This is my Body: it is
broken for you." After supper, he took the
cup, he offered you thanks, and gave it to
them saying: "Drink this, all of you. This is
my Blood of the new covenant; it is poured
out for you, and for all, that sins may be
forgiven. Do this in remembrance of me."
We now obey your Son's command We
recall his blessed passion and death, his
glorious resurrection and ascension; and we
look for the coming of his Kingdom. Made
one with him, we offer you these gifts and
with them ourselves a single, holy living
sacrifice. Hear us, most merciful Father, and
send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this
bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by
his life-giving power, they may be the Body
and Blood of your Son, and we may be

kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your Kingdom. Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, the apostles, and prophets, and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end. **Amen.**
