

# ST. JOSEPH'S ALTAR Friday, March 18th (Eve of the Feast Day) 5:30pm - GYM

(An Italian tradition with St. Patrick's Day included)

The Feast of St. Joseph, which always falls in the middle of Lent (March 19th), is specially commemorated and celebrated with a shrine and feast in many Italian churches and families. In Italy it is also Father's Day—fitting, as St. Joseph was, of course, the foster father of Jesus. This celebration is a symbolic "thank you" to Saint Joseph. It is a shared celebration with the entire community where the riches of food are given as alms to the poor: traditional etiquette is that no one can be turned away from this table. The heart of this tradition can be found in these three aspects:

> \*Veneration—special recognition of St. Joseph during Mass and at the "table."

\*The Altar or Table—both a kind of "altar of reverence", and a communal celebration.

\*The Poor—The intention of all the gifts is to help those in need.

Parishioners bring symbolic foods to the Altar to share. Irish AND Italian foods are welcome to celebrate St. Patrick and St. Joseph since the feast days are so close to one another. Donations and non-perishable goods will be collected to support the poor of our community. #### **GUIDELINES FOR FASTING & ABSTINENCE**

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics, 14 years of age or older, on all Fridays during Lent (Code of Canon Law 1249-53). Abstinence and fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on the Friday of the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ (all adults are bound by the law of fast until the beginning of their sixtieth year). On all the weekdays of Lent, the U.S. Bishops strongly encourage the faithful to participate in Mass and to observe a self-imposed fast. The law of fasting allows only one full meal a day but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning and evening. Customarily, the two smaller "collations" when considered together, should not equal the main meal and ideally should be eaten only if needed to maintain one's strength.

## \*WHAT IS TENEBRAE?

"Tenebrae is named after the Latin word for darkness and is a unique celebration typically of the early morning prayers of the Divine Office for the three days of the Easter Triduum. Tenebrae is first and foremost a catena of prayer. Scripture readings, and homiletic texts in which the words, events, and imagery of the Old and New Testaments converge. It has become the Church's cry of anguish in contemplating the death of her Divine Bridegroom. The immediate context concerns the fall of Jerusalem to the Babylonians, but their underlying meaning transcends the limits of any one point in history. What is being recounted is not simply the ruin of a city. It is the ruin and downfall of a universe, a lament for the entire gamut of human suffering that has descended upon the world because of the sin of Adam. It is a vision of destruction on an apocalyptic scale, a catastrophic vision of a world without Christ, a world without God." Tenebrae includes the use of fifteen candles on a hearse, the triangular candlestand. There is a ceremonial extinction of these candles as the prayers progress leaving one candle lit at the end of the rite, symbolizing Christ.
