Parent Education Series on Supporting Challenging Behavior

**Calling all parents, caregivers, and family members
of children with disabilities ages 3-12 years old!**

Funded by the Research Royalty Fund at the University of Washington, the Haring Center for Inclusive Education is recruiting parents and caregivers of children with disabilities ages 3-12 years old to participate in a remote parent education series on challenging behavior. This study aims to increase parents' knowledge and skills on strategies and supports to prevent and respond to challenging behavior at home. We hope to develop a community that is a safe space for parents and caregivers to share their experiences, offer support to one another, and strategize together to support challenging behavior at home.

In this 12-week remote series, we will take a strengths-based approach to partner together to cover behavioral skills and strategies to support challenging behavior, as well as strategies to teach new skills and behaviors. This parent education series includes a Behavior Analyst, Special Education Teacher, mental health provider, as well as a family advocate.
