- 4.0 Language Arts
- 3.0 Math (through Algebra 2 or alternative CTE equivalent)
- 3.0 Science
- 3.0 History (World History 1, 2 & 3, US History A/B, American Government)
- 1.0 Fine Art
- 1.0 CTE
- 1.5 PE
- .5 Health
- 7.0 Electives

- **Middle School credits counting for High School Credits**

- MS classes that count for HS credit will not automatically be added to your HS transcript
- To add MS classes to HS transcript you must submit the MS to HS credit transfer form to Ms. Hayes
- MS Classes that count for high school credit: Biology 1&2, Physical Science 1&2, Algebra 1A&1B, Algebra 2A&2B, Geometry A&B, Algebra 1A-M&1B-M, French 1A&1B, Japanese 1A&1B, Chinese 1A&1B, Spanish 1A&1B

- **PE Credits**

- Log activity hours on PE Credit Form (found on TCS website and School Counselor Schoology page and in the hallway by Ms. Hayes's office)
- 75 hours = .5 credit
- Students need 1.5 credits or 225 hours for graduation
- Turn in completed PE forms to Ms. Tracey Lott. Deadline: End of 1<sup>st</sup> semester of your senior year.
- The sooner you complete these hours/credits, the better!

- **Service-Learning Hours**

- Students are required to complete **60 hours** of Service Learning (15 hrs/year)
- Current Service-Learning opportunities are posted on the TCS website/Resources /Career Center/Service-Learning Bulletin AND on the bulletin board in the 3rd floor hallway
- Completed Service-Learning Forms

- **Graduation Pathway**

- Graduation Pathways help students prepare for what comes after high school and signals employers and college/institutions of student's readiness for the next step
- SPS has identified the following Graduation Pathways:
- Career-Technical Field = CTE Course Sequence (including either a dual credit course or a course that leads to an industry recognized certification)
- Post-Secondary Education = ELA & Math Courses (and Exams)
- Military Career Interest = ASVAB Exam (AFQT)

- i. Graduation Pathway Examples

- Post-Secondary Pathway**

- Option 1: (Exams)**

- Qualifying score for SBA, SAT, or ACT in both ELA **AND** Math

- Option 2: (Courses)**

- AP ELA (TCS 12th grade) **AND** AP Stats or Calculus **AND** earn a C+ or higher **OR**

- Running Start ELA 100 level or higher **AND** Running Start Math 100 level or higher

- Option 3:** A combination of 2 above (exam and course)

- Example 1:* AP ELA class grade of C+ **AND** SBAC Score in Math of 2595

- Example 2:* SAT in ELA of 410 or higher **AND** AP Calculus class grade of C+

- **Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA)**

- Go to the Source
- Check your Credit History
- Did you fail an ELA class OR Math class? If so, you can substitute a passing SBAC score for one semester of one of these courses
  - e.g., You failed 9th grade World Literature 1st semester? Substitute a passing SBAC ELA score
  - e.g., You failed Geometry 1A 1st semester in 9th grade? Substitute a passing SBAC Math score

- **Military ASVAB Exam**

- Stands for 'Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery'
- Focus on 'AFQT' (Armed Forces Qualification Test)
- AFQT contains:
  - Arithmetic Reasoning (AR)
  - Mathematics Knowledge (MK)
  - Paragraph Comprehension (PC)
  - Word Knowledge (WK)
- What score do I need to pass this exam?
  - 31 out of 99

\*This does not mean you're committing to join the military!\*

- **High School and Beyond Plan -Naviance**
