

Junior Health Scholar

The Junior Health Scholar program allows high school students between the ages of 16-18 to shadow a current Health Scholar and observe how patient care and administrative teams work together to deliver excellent care and to explore whether a career in health care is right for them. The program is offered year-round at select sites in California, Washington and Hawaii. Most individuals complete the program in 9 months with a commitment of one 4-hour shift per week. For those looking to complete the program faster, we offer a 3-month option where you will receive priority to select up to three 4-hour shifts per week.

- Understand best practices for patient interaction through observation-based rotations and witness the dynamics within the patient care team firsthand
- Shadow Health Scholar mentors to see health care in action and contribute to patient comfort care
- Learn about various health care careers and roles of all the patient care team members
- Receive preferred admission into the Health Scholar program

- Enrolled in high school or an accredited college or university
- 16-18 years old at time of program start
- Attend a minimum of one 4-hour shift per week
